# **Precinct Updates for the November election**



In this past June Primary, some precincts were moved to another location due to summer school and renovations. For the upcoming November election, those precincts who were moved previously will be returning to their original location, except for **Precinct 606** and **Precinct 810**. Please read the update below for details:

Precinct 105: Returning to Mary Munford Elementary School.

Precinct 308: Returning to Linwood Holton Elementary School.

Precinct 409: Returning to JB Fisher Elementary School.

Precinct 410: Returning to Huguenot High School.

Precinct 606: Will remain at Overby Sheppard Elementary School.

Precinct 705: Returning to Henry Marsh Elementary School.

**Precinct 810**: Permanently relocating to Metropolitan African American Baptist Church.

Precinct 908: Returning to Miles Jones Elementary School.

Precinct 911: Will be temporarily be moving to River City Middle School.

## High School Page Program

With the help of fellow Election Officer, **Operadella Williams**, our office is excited to announce that we will soon be launching the high school Page Program. The program offers "an engaging and educational experience that honors and preserves the electoral process" to the students.

The pages will shadow and assist Chief and Assistant Chiefs as greeters and setup assistants. In the upcoming November election, the number of pages assigned to each precinct will be based on the amount of pages recruited and the turnout of precincts.

Our office is working diligently with Richmond Public Schools and City of Richmond private schools to promote the program amongst 16 to 17 year old high school students.

The application process will begin the first week of school. Along with the application, each student must submit:

- A maximum 500 word essay "Why do I want to be a Page?"
- Parental consent form
- Recommendation from history or government teacher.

Once accepted into the program, the page must attend mandatory training. The training will include greeting voters, cell phone usage, dress code, and other code of ethics.

On Election Day, the page is expected to show up on time to help set up or wrap up the precinct, depending on which time slot he or she is assigned for. Pages are not allowed to assist with any ballot related duties.

There is no compensation for the pages, however, the General Registrar will provide a certificate of participation. The hours can also be counted towards community service hours and included on resumes.

We are extremely excited to introduce this program. The Page Program is "designed to provide an opportunity for civic minded and responsible high school students to support the elections process."

Again, a big thank you to Operadella Williams for helping to launch the program.

# What to expect for this upcoming election

#### **Provisional Ballot Officers**

Starting with the November election, **all assistant chiefs** will be designated as the lead provisional ballot officer for their precinct. If you are an assistant chief, our office will be contacting you with more information.



#### **Early Voting Schedule**

September 20, 2024: Start of Early Voting at Office of Elections M-F from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

October 7, 2024: Satellite locations open for Early Voting.

- City Hall will be open 8:30 a.m to 5 p.m.
- Hickory Hill Community Center will be open 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

October 14, 2024: Office Closed for Indigenous Peoples Day

October 26, 2024 & November 2, 2024: Office of Elections and Satellite locations will be open for Saturday voting.

November 2, 2024: Last day of Early Voting.

### Accessibility and Emergency Training for Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs.

Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs are required to attend both the emergency and accessibility classes. Dates for the classes are:

- Monday, August 19: Emergency Class 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Wednesday, August 21: Accessibility Class 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Saturday, August 24: Emergency Class 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. AND Accessibility Class 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

Online training for new election officers will begin September 23.

# National Poll Worker Recruitment Day

Did you know that August 1, 2024 is National Poll Worker Recruitment Day? National Poll Worker Recruitment Day is a National Day of Action established by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) in 2020 to inspire civic engagement and encourage people to sign up to become a poll worker.

#### **Availability Survey**



## **TRAINING**

- Election Officers MUST sign up/register for their training class(es) through Integra. If you have not registered for class, you will not be able to attend.
- Officers are allowed to take class(es) that are specific to their role at the precinct. Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs can take all classes as a refresher.
- Our office will send you a reminder, via text, that you have an upcoming training.
- Officers must arrive on time, should you arrive over 15 minutes late, you will need to reschedule your class. We can assist you with rescheduling your class(es).
- Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs will receive the training calendar. It is mandatory that Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs take the Chief or Assistant Chief training.
- \*\*NEW CLASS FOR CHIEFS AND ASSISTANT CHIEFS\*\* Please check your Integra portal beginning August 1st to sign up for these classes. Training will occur in August.
  - Accessibility Training
  - Emergency Training
- Some training classes will include hands-on training, to give you an example of what Election Day may look like.
- Some weekday classes will begin at 5:00 PM.
- \*\*NEW election officers\*\* there will be a virtual Q & A class to ask any questions you may have from the online training class. Check your Integra portal beginning August 1st to register for this class.
