Other relevant messages expressed by citizens or speakers during the event	Marshal of Pomorskie Voivodeship Mieczyslaw Struk spoke about the European Committee of the Regions and its role in the decision-making process in the European Union as an exponent of the voices of citizens of EU cities and regions. He also spoke about the CoR's initiative "Green Deal Going Local" and about the importance of environmental issues for regional authorities and local communities. He emphasized the role of young people in the green transformation. He encouraged young people to make conscious decisions and life choices, but also to become active citizens. Young students who already have the right to vote were encouraged by Mr. Struk to take part in the upcoming elections (parliamentary, local and European elections). Mr. Marshal stressed the role of local self-governments in implementing goals and priorities at the local and regional levels. He pointed out the Pomorskie region's development priorities in the context of EU funds. He also spoke about the active young people who participate in the Youth Assembly of the Pomeranian Voivodeship and the opportunity for all to be members of this body. He said that politicians should listen to young people, to learn their opinions, but also their needs and expectations. He asked young people about their priorities in life, expectations, goals, aspirations. Young participants were asked to write 5 issues most important to them. A summary of the votes showed that young people from Kartuski District put good education first, family second, a good job third, money fourth, personal development fifth, and health (including mental health) sixth. Dr. Aleksandra Borowicz of the University of Gdansk, a member of Team Europe, described the current priorities of the European Union and the main activities of the European Commission and the European Parliament in the context of current local and global challenges. Mr. Bogdan Łapa, the Governor of Kartuski District spoke about local development and the use of EU funds for education, health and
