Dear Mr. López Aguilar,

Following the presentation of the Second Joint Review Report of the Terrorist Finance Tracking Program Agreement between the European Union and the United States (hereafter: TFTP Agreement) in the LIBE Committee of the European Parliament on Tuesday 18 December 2012, I wish to inform you on behalf of the Article 29 Working Party that I do not endorse the statements made by a representative of the European Commission during that meeting.

The European Commission has erroneously presented conclusions to your Committee that where not agreed by the delegation during the preparation of the report. I specifically refer to the remark that "all members of the EU Review Team have confirmed the press release of the JSB Europol was wrong". Furthermore, I find it unacceptable that the European Commission has publicly cast doubt on the integrity of the two representatives of the data protection authorities in the Joint Review team, based upon the fact that they also take part in the inspections of a part of the TFTP Agreement that are carried out by the JSB Europol. The Article 29 Working Party has deliberately put forward these two experts for participation in the Joint Review because of their full knowledge and understanding of both the TFTP Agreement and the workings of the Terrorist Finance Tracking Program.

At the start of the New Year, I will get in touch with the European Commission to further discuss this difference of opinion. I will of course ensure that the European Parliament is informed about the outcome of such a meeting as well. However, until the moment such a discussion has taken place, the Article 29 Working Party hereby suspends all participation into the oversight mechanism of the TFTP Agreement.
