


Who is Who in International Protection in the EU+ Platform

The [Who is Who in International Protection](#) platform contains interactive mappings of key stakeholders and their roles in various areas of asylum and reception systems.



The platform presents the roles and responsibilities of actors involved in international protection in each EU+ country, in addition to their mandates as defined by national policies and legislation. The interlinks between different authorities and institutions are also outlined. The mappings cover the implementation of concepts and policies related to the Common European Asylum System.

The Who is Who platform is regularly updated with new topics and data visualisations. Many of the thematic overviews have accompanying reports available in PDF.

The data visualisations present the countries which implement the concepts of a safe country of origin, a safe third country and a European safe third country in order to process an asylum application accordingly.

Hover over a country and "click more" to view relevant information about the implementation of safe country concept in each country.

Overview of countries applying the concept of safe third countries

Use the arrows at the top-left corner to navigate to the next data visualisation. Hover over a country and "click more" to view countries which have adopted a list of designated safe countries.

Example of the interactive visualisation of countries applying the safe country concept



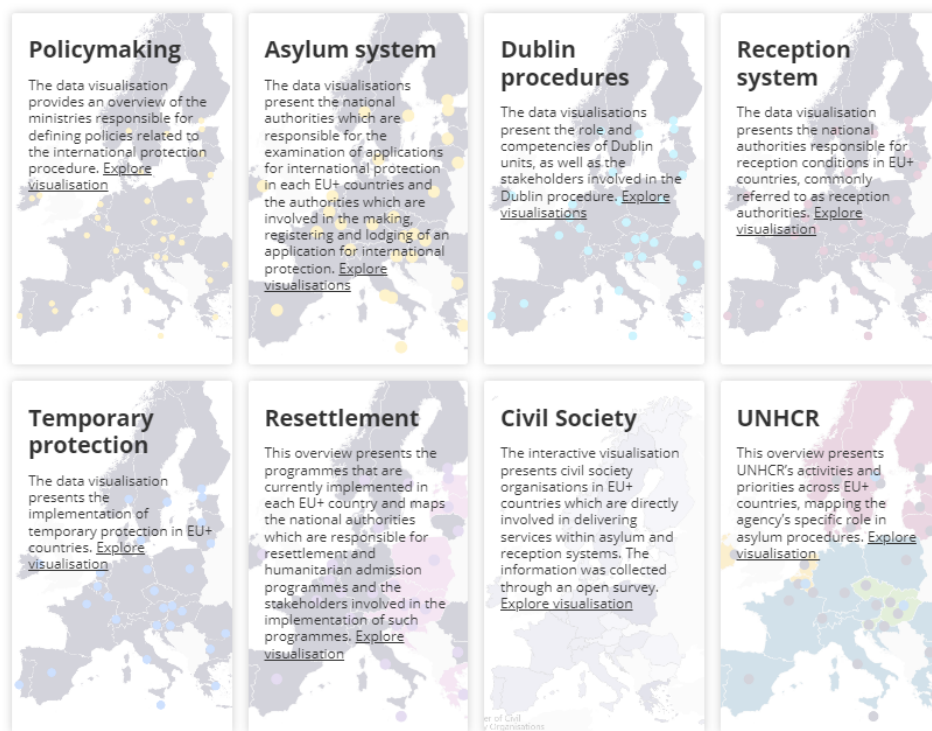


Methodology

The information presented on the platform is gathered through desk research based on publicly-available sources and EUAA reports. Entries are validated by EU+ countries and other stakeholders, if required, for example the EUAA Consultative Forum for information from civil society organisations.
