406.16	Activity Requirements	Caregiver and parents discuss child's health, development, behavior and activities to ensure consistently.		
406.17	Nutrition/Meals	Caregiver is providing nutrition per the standards.		
406.18	Transportation	The caregiver meets the expectations of the standards for transportation.		
406.19	Swimming	The swimming provisions meet the expectation of the standards for swimming.
