Ethnicity Facts and Figures and the Sustainable Development Goals

To meet the SDGs we need data - particularly disaggregated data to understand where the greatest inequalities are, inform policy change and measure impact - to improve outcomes.

The Race Disparity Unit (RDU) is working with the Office of National Statistics (ONS) to map and disaggregate UK Data including by ethnicity to inform delivery and reporting of the SDGs.

There are over 170 pages on the **Ethnicity Facts and Figures** website – 80 provide similar data as required by SDG indicators.



How we got here 2016-17

Aug 2016: The Prime Minister launches an unprecedented audit of public services to end burning injustices and reveal how people from different backgrounds are treated.



Oct 2017: The Prime Minister publishes the website and challenges society to "explain or change" and launches policies on education, employment and health to tackle disparities.



How we got here 2018-19

Oct 2018: The Prime Minister launches a consultation on mandatory ethnicity reporting and policies on procurement and senior ethnic representation in



February 2019: The Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster announced universities will be held to account through access and participation plans
