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### **Council will vote on adoption of 2015 Roadmap Report**

**Olympia** — On Dec. 10, the council will review the final draft of the 2015 Roadmap Report before voting on adoption. This 2015 Roadmap is the first progress report on Washington State’s educational attainment goals, that by 2023:

- All adults in Washington, ages 25–44, will have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- At least 70 percent of Washington adults, ages 25–44, will have a postsecondary credential.

Once the report is adopted and finalized, the council will submit it to the Legislature and Governor’s Office.
