DESTINATION THE PHILIPPINES

FOR the ultimate large group trip enter a new private island in the Philippines. Ariara is one of the partially jungle-covered Calamian Islands in Palawan, surrounded by

white sand and coral reefs. British couple Charles and Carrie McCulloch have spent the past six years creating this 125-acre private island retreat, now ready for guests. It's designed by Filipino architect Jorge Yulo using local materials huge marble baths carved from single blocks of Romblon marble, wood and rattan; cushions made from tribal fabrics: and intricate wooden chests carved by indigenous Palawan woodcarvers. Wind and

solar power energy sources are also in operation.

The lodge is the main hub for eating Euro-Asian cuisine and socialising. It features high vaulted ceilings, floor to ceiling glass doors and a cinemastyle projector complete with extensive DVD library. There is even a masseuse.

Eight villas and suites, sleeping up to 17, are set along the beach, all with private terraces, gardens and hammocks. Many have vaulted ceilings, four-poster beds and open-air showers.
