On the Eve of Israel's 69th Independence Day – 8.7 Million Residents in the State of Israel

Then and Now:

Selected Data on Life in the State of Israel in the Early Years Compared with Today

• The population of Israel numbers approximately 8.680 million persons¹ on the eve of Israel's 69th Independence Day, 2017.

At the time of the establishment of the State, it numbered 806,000 residents.

On the State of Israel's 100th Independence Day, in 2048, the population is expected to reach 15.2 million persons.²

- The **Jewish population** numbers approximately 6,484,000 residents (74.7% of the total population); the **Arab population** numbers approximately 1,808,000 residents (20.8%); and the population of Others³ numbers about 388,000 (4.5%).
- Since Independence Day last year,⁴ the **population increased by 159,000 persons**, an increase of about 1.9%.
- There have been approximately 174,000 **infants born** since last Independence Day, and about 44,000 people passed away; about 30,000 immigrants⁵ arrived in Israel.
- Age distribution in Israel: 34.6% are of ages 0-18; 54.3% are of ages 19-64; 11.1% are aged 65 or over.
- At the end of 2015 there were about 45,000 residents aged 90 or over living in Israel.

- About 75% of the total Jewish population were 'Sabras' persons born in Israel (more than half are at least the second generation in the country) compared with only 35% native-born in 1948.
- Degree of religiosity:⁶

Among Jews: 44% are not religious, secular; 24% are traditional, not so religious; 12% are religious traditional; 11% religious; and 9% ultra-Orthodox.

Among non-Jews: 52% are religious, 23% are not so religious, 21% are not religious, and 4% very religious.

What is life actually like in Israel?

89% of persons aged 20 and over are satisfied with life; 59% are satisfied with their financial situation; 52% estimate that their life will be better in the future and 44% estimate that their financial situation will improve.

Area

Area of the country: 22,072 sq. km.

This is an area similar to Slovenia or El Salvador;

or about half the size of the Netherlands or Switzerland.

The State of Israel is 30 times larger than Singapore.

However, the area of Israel could fit 450 times in the area of the United States or China.

Land area: 21,643 sq. km. (97.6%)

Area of lakes: 429 sq. km. (2.4%)

This includes the Sea of Galilee (164 sq. km.) and the Dead Sea (265 sq. km.)

Land border: Total length of border: 857 km., approximately like the distance from Metula to Eilat, round

trip.

Length of Mediterranean Sea Coast: 194 km.

Length of Red Sea Coast: 12 km.

Lowest point: The Dead Sea (429 m. below sea level)

Highest point: Mount Hermon (2,224 m)

The only river in Israel: The Jordan River, approximately 250 km.

The largest locality: Jerusalem with 865,700 residents

The smallest locality: Neve Zohar (in the Tamar Regional Council) with 71 residents

In 1948 there was only one city in Israel with more than 100,000 residents – Tel Aviv-Jaffa.

Today, 14 cities number more than 100,000 residents. Of these, eight cities number more than 200,000 residents: Jerusalem, Tel Aviv-Jaffa, Haifa, Rishon Leziyyon, Petah Tiqwa, Ashdod, Netanya and Be'er Sheva.
