1. Objectives

To ensure uniform and effective implementation of conservation and control measures applicable to pelagic fisheries in Western Waters (WW) as specified in Commission Decision 2012/807/EU, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and at the ports of landing, and throughout the whole chain including processing, transport and trade.

2. Summary of activity

This report provides overall summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out by air, sea and shore based assets and inspection teams of the participating Member States (MS) from 2nd of January until 31th December, 2017.

a) Inspections ashore

During this joint campaign reporting period 392.364 tonnes of pelagic catches were inspected at landing. In total, there were 680 inspections carried out ashore and reported 5 suspected infringements were detected on 5 fishing vessels.

b) Inspections at sea

During this joint campaign reporting period 74.896 tonnes of pelagic catches were monitored at sea. In total, there were 125 inspections carried out at sea. There were 2 infringements reported from 2 fishing vessels.
