<p align="center">WHAT DATA WE COLLECT?</p>	<p>Name and function, contact details (e-mail address, business telephone number, mobile telephone number, fax number, postal address, company and department, country of residence, internet address); Certificates for social security contributions and taxes paid, extract from judicial records; Bank account reference (IBAN and BIC codes), VAT number; Information for the evaluation of selection criteria: expertise, technical skills and languages, educational background, professional experience including details on current and past employment.</p>

<p align="center">WHO HAS ACCESS TO YOUR DATA?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Designated EFCA staff - Members of the public; In case you are awarded a contract by the EFCA, your personal data will be made public, in accordance with the EFCA's obligation to publish information on the outcome of the procurement procedure. The information will concern in particular your name and address, the amount awarded and the name of the project for which you are awarded a contract. It will be published in supplement S of the Official Journal of the European Union and/or on the website of the EFCA. - The competent EU bodies in case of a monitoring or inspection task in accordance with European Union law.

<p>HOW DO WE PROTECT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?</p>	<p>A number of technical and organisational measures have been put in place by the Agency. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access according to the EFCA Information Security Policy. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.</p>
<p>HOW LONG DO WE KEEP YOUR DATA?</p>	<p>For successful tenderers, files are retained in the archives for at least five years from the date on which the European Parliament grants discharge for the budgetary year in which the contract terminates;</p> <p>For unsuccessful tenderers, files are retained in the archives for at least five years from the date on which the European Parliament grants discharge for the budgetary year in which the contract is signed;</p> <p>The above limits can be extended until the end of a possible audit if one started before the end of the above period.</p>
<p>YOUR RIGHTS AS DATA SUBJECT</p>	<p>You have the right to access all your personal data, including the supporting documents, and may request them to be updated and rectified, blocked or erased.</p>
