In 2021, GEPAC raised \$555,408 from more than 1,450 employees. GEPAC contributed \$533,000 to candidates and committees in federal elections in the United States. GEPAC also contributed \$70,000 to national governors' associations but did not contribute to state candidates or committees in 2021.
