Second Amendment to Local Emergency Measures

The below additional Emergency Measures are hereby instituted due to the declaration and proclamation that a State of Local Emergency exists within the City of Miami, County of Miami-Dade, Florida and in accordance with the Florida Governor's Executive Order 20-52.

Second Amended Emergency Measures Promulgated on March 17, 2020.

CLOSURE OF CERTAIN BUSINESSES AND ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE CITY

- 1. All Alcohol service establishments in the City of Miami that do not serve food shall be closed to the public.
- 2. All restaurants and retail food facilities in the City of Miami shall be prohibited from serving food for consumption in dining areas on premises. Restaurants and retail food facilities may continue to operate for the sole purposes of preparing and offering food to customers via delivery, third-party delivery service, carry-out or drive-thru amenities at any hour. For those establishments offering food carry out options, proprietors are directed to establish social distancing practices for those patrons in the queue for pick-up.
 - 3. The following are exempt from this Measure:
 - Cafeterias, commissaries, and restaurants located entirely within hospitals, restaurants with drive-thru amenities, nursing homes, or similar facilities
 - b. Grocery stores
 - c. Pharmacies
 - d. Food banks
- 4. All movie theaters, live performance venues, bowling alleys and arcades located in the City of Miami shall be closed to the public.
 - 5. All gyms and fitness centers shall be closed to the public.

The above Second Amended measures shall take effect on March 17, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.

LIMITATION OF OCCUPANCY LOAD AT CERTAIN PLACES

- 1. No businesses or establishments of any kind in the City shall be permitted to operate, and shall immediately cease all business activities and operations, if, at any time, the total occupancy load of any business or establishment meets or exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the business's or establishment's authorized total occupancy load. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all businesses or establishments may avoid the prohibition set forth herein, if such business or establishment immediately reduces its occupancy load to fifty percent (50%) of the business's or establishment's authorized total occupancy load.
- 2. Notwithstanding the above, no businesses or establishments of any kind with an occupancy load of five-hundred (500) or more, shall be permitted to operate, if, at any time, the total occupancy load of any business or establishment meets or exceeds two-hundred and fifty (250) persons.

HOURS OF OPERATION FOR BUSINESSES AND ESTABLISHMENTS

1. All non-essential businesses and establishments within the territorial limits of the City of Miami shall be required to CLOSE by no later than 11:59 p.m. commencing on March 17, 2020 (including weeknights and weekends) and may resume operations upon termination of these emergency Measures. The term "non-essential businesses" shall exclude the following: pharmacies, grocery stores, convenience stores, private offices, banks, hotels, hospitals, medical service providers, medical supply stores, hardware stores, gasoline service stations, automotive supply/repair centers, and food

service establishments that offer carry-out and/or delivery service, and restaurants with drive-thru amenities.

CLOSING OF PLACES OF ASSEMBLAGE IN THE CITY

As City Manager I hereby authorize the closure of places of public 1. assemblage, with designated exceptions.

Assemblage by any person or persons in such closed place is hereby 2. prohibited.

BAN ON UNCONSCIONABLE PRICING (PRICE GOUGING)

No person shall during a declared state of local emergency impose 1. unconscionable prices for any essential commodity, including but not limited to goods, supplies, services, provisions, materials, resources, equipment, or any article of commerce and includes, without limitation water, food, ice, chemicals, petroleum products, and lumber necessary for consumption and/or use as a direct result of the emergency.

No person shall during a declared state of local emergency impose 2. unconscionable prices for the rental or lease of any dwelling unit or storage facility.
