4. National Recruitment Survey Working Group

Report:

The results of the Winter 2016 survey, which solicited feedback on the Toronto and Calgary first year summer 2016 recruitment processes and the Ottawa second year summer 2016 recruitment process, were summarized and distributed via NALP Connect in August. Employers in those markets who

received specific comments were emailed individual reports as well. Results from the Summer 2016 survey (articling recruitment in all markets) will be distributed in February 2017.

Preliminary results from the Fall 2016 survey soliciting feedback on the Calgary, Vancouver and Toronto second year recruitment processes for summer 2017 were presented at the NALP Winter Meeting in December, specifically student feedback on the Ontario "cooling off" period. The Working Group will work towards a Summary Report of the fall survey results.

As two full years of surveying have now been completed, the Working Group engaged in consultation with NALP staff, Judy Collins and Jim Leipold. After consultation, the Working Group decided to continue with surveying students each recruitment cycle (Fall, Winter, Spring), but NALP will no longer prepare individual school survey links and, due to the onerous nature of reporting, will only produce a full Summary Report approximately once per year and specific reports regarding a particular issue (*e.g.* changes to the Law Society Procedures) when needed for discussion. The Working Group is currently accepting feedback to determine when to produce Employer-specific reports.

The group will also continue to work with the Summer and Articling Working Group to identify best practices in the design and implementation of future surveys.
