INTRODUCTION

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is rapidly transforming industries and societies across the globe, by automating tasks, enhancing decision-making processes, and creating new economic opportunities. The potential economic impact of AI on the MENA region's economic growth is significant, with the region estimated to accrue \$320 billion by 2030 from value added by AI^[1]. This roundtable aims to explore current AI trends, showcase successful implementations in key industries, and discuss the critical roles of both government and the private sector in advancing AI. By bringing together policymakers, industry experts, chambers and innovators, this roundtable will provide a platform for insightful discussions and collaborative strategies for harnessing the power of AI.

Co-organized by the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) and the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA), the roundtable is hosted by the ICC-ESCWA Centre of Entrepreneurship and engages primarily Chambers of Commerce and ICC National Committees from across the Arab region, with a particular focus on Bahrain, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Morocco, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia and the United Arab Emirates.
