

Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris 4.0 Release Notes

This document provides last-minute information about Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris, including system requirements, installation and upgrade procedure, as well as relevant information on technical support, documentation, online resources and so on.

System Requirements

Hardware

CPU: Oracle SPARC or Intel x86 processor.

Memory: 1 GB RAM (for standard backup and restore operations) / 4 GB RAM (for bare-metal recovery).

For information about RAM requirements for backup of a great number of files, see the RAM Requirements for Large Numbers of Files section in the Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris User Guide.

Disk Space: 250 MB free disk space for product installation.

Network: 10 Mbps or faster network connection to a backup target.

OS

Oracle Solaris 10 – 11.4 operating systems on machines based on the SPARC and Intel x86 architecture are supported.

File Systems

All file systems supported by the supported operating systems.

Software

The following utilities must be installed on the machine:

- **mlocate** (version 0.26-1 or later) required for file system indexing. If your system does not have the mlocate utility, you can install it from the product installation media.
- tar required for file system indexing, exporting and rotating logs. It is installed with the product.
- gzip required for file system indexing, exporting and rotating logs. It must be installed separately.
- xorriso required for creating Veeam Recovery Media.

Oracle Solaris minimal install (Core System Support Software Group) requires adding the following packages: **SUMWtoo, SUNWzoneu, SUNWzoner**.

Backup Target

Backup can be performed to the following disk-based storage:

- Local (internal) storage of the protected computer (not recommended)
- Direct attached storage (DAS), such as USB, eSATA or Firewire external drives
- Network Attached Storage (NAS) able to represent itself as SMB (CIFS) or NFS share
- Veeam Backup & Replication 11a backup repository (Veeam Cloud Connect repositories are not supported)

Considerations and Limitations

General

- Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris does not back up extended attributes and ACL of backed-up files and directories.
- Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris backs up and restores sparse files as standard data files.
- Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris backs up and restores file system snapshots as standard data files.

Bare Metal Recovery

- Bare-metal recovery to dissimilar hardware is not supported.
- Bare-metal recovery of SVM configurations is not supported.
- Bare-metal recovery from backups created from within non-global zones is not supported.
- Bare-metal recovery only from file-level backups created by version 4.0.0.1029 of Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris is supported.
- Bare-metal recovery requires a backup that includes the full contents of the root directory (the -- includedirs option must be set to /).
- [Oracle Solaris 11.4] To create Veeam Recovery Media, Veeam Agent must have access to Oracle Solaris Image Packaging System (IPS).

Known Issues

General

- If Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris is installed in a global zone on Oracle Solaris 10, it is not installed automatically into non-global zones.
- If Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris is installed in a global zone, store path in non-global zones will not be excluded automatically.
- Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris is unable to perform file system indexing if multiple **mlocate** tools are present in the system.
- Enumeration progress is not shown in the beginning of a backup session.
- If an overall source data size significantly increases in comparison to the size of data backed up during the previous backup job session, Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris will create an active full backup.
- If the network connection between Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris and Veeam backup repository is interrupted during a backup or restore operation, the operation must be restarted because Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris cannot automatically reconnect to Veeam backup server.

Bare Metal Recovery

• Paths longer than 1006 symbols cannot be restored during bare-metal recovery and must be restored manually afterwards.

Installing Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris

To install Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris:

- 1. Download the installation archive from the Veeam Download page at https://www.veeam.com/downloads.html.
- 2. Extract the contents of the installation archive to a directory that can be accessed from the machine where you want to install the product. For example, this can be a directory in the local file system or an NFS directory.
- 3. Navigate to the directory where you extracted the archive with the cd command, and then use the following command:
 - For Oracle Solaris 10 and 11 on x86 architecture:

```
pkgadd -G -d ./VeeamAgent-4.0.1.1173-i86pc.pkg
```

• For Oracle Solaris 10 and 11 on SPARC architecture:

```
pkgadd -G -d ./VeeamAgent-4.0.1.1173-sparc.pkg
```

Updating Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris

IMPORTANT

Make sure that there are no jobs running on the host before update!

Update from versions earlier than 2.0.0.123 is not supported. If you run an earlier version of the product, update the product to version 2.0, and then update it to version 3.0.

To update from version 2.0.0.123 or later, use the following command:

• For Oracle Solaris 10 and 11 on x86 architecture:

```
pkgadd -G -d ./VeeamAgent-4.0.1.1173-i86pc.pkg
```

• For Oracle Solaris 10 and 11 on SPARC architecture:

```
pkgadd -G -d ./VeeamAgent-4.0.1.1173-sparc.pkg
```

Uninstalling Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris

To uninstall Veeam Agent for IBM AIX, use the following command:

pkgrm VeeamAgent

By installing Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris, you agree to the Veeam End User License Agreement (EULA) and 3rd party components license agreements. To view the license agreements, visit the following link: https://www.veeam.com/eula.html.

To work with Veeam Agent for Oracle Solaris, you must obtain a license key and install it on the protected machine.
