A vehicle floated off the road between Medford and Pond Creek. **Grant County** 30 1830CST 1930CST **Jefferson** O 0 Flash Flood Eighteen inches of water were reported over streets. Showers and thunderstorms produced measured rainfall totals ranging from six to almost nine inches across Grant County. This heavy rain caused many closings of major highways through the area due to flash flooding. Three to five inches of rain which fell across portions of Roger Mills County also caused the Washita River to flood. **Murray County** 1 S Davis 31 0530CST 0730CST 0 Flash Flood Water was reported over Highway 77. **Murray County** 0540CST 0910CST **Turner Falls Park** 31 0.50KFlash Flood The park at Turner Falls was closed due to flash flooding. About 2,000 campers were stranded and forced to move to high ground until waters receded. Flood waters washed a few tents, logs, trash barrels, and other large debris down the Honey Creek into the Blue Hole swimming area. An air conditioning unit was also blown off the roof of an auto shop where it fell on top of a car, damaging the windshield and denting the hood.
