SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 56

A RESOLUTION TO DECLARE THE INTENT OF THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE
RELATIVE TO THE PROMOTION OF RACE OR SEX STEREOTYPING OR
SCAPEGOATING IN VIOLATION OF THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence, adopted on July 4,

- 5 1776, by the Second Continental Congress, affirms that "We hold
- 6 these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal";
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, the Gettysburg Address, delivered by President
- 9 Abraham Lincoln on November 19, 1863, confirms that "Four score
- 10 and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a
- 11 new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition
- 12 that all men are created equal; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Fourteenth Amendment of the Constitution of the
- 14 United States, ratified on July 9, 1868, decrees that "No state
- 15 shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges
- 16 or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any
- 17 state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without

- 18 due process of law, nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction
- 19 the equal protection of the laws"; and
- 20 WHEREAS, critical race theory and related ideologies
- 21 propagate divisive and untrue concepts that teach one race or sex
- 22 is inherently superior to another and that individuals of one race
- 23 or sex should be deprived of basic rights simply because of their
- 24 race or sex; and
- 25 WHEREAS, it is contrary to the laws of God and nature that an
- 26 individual's moral character is necessarily determined by his or
- 27 her race or sex and that that individual should thus be
- 28 discriminated against in the classroom the workplace or any public
- 29 forum or place:
- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State
- 31 of Mississippi affirms its resolute opposition to the promotion of
- 32 race or sex stereotyping or scapegoating and condemns the use of
- 33 diverse concepts and theories that propagate such stereotyping and
- 34 scapegoating.
- 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 36 transmitted to each member of the Mississippi congressional
- 37 delegation and made available to Capitol Press Corps.
