**JEFFERSON DAVIS
MEMORIAL SERVICE**

Interesting Service at Carnegie Hall by Members of L. S. Ross Chapter, U. D. C.

At 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon the members of L. S. Ross Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy, and others, assembled at Carnegie Hall for the purpose of observing the natal day of Jefferson Davis, president of the Confederate States of America.

The meeting was presided over by Mrs. W. G. Tallafiero, president of the chapter, and the entire program proved to be of deep interest and was greatly enjoyed by all present.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Dr. M. E. Weaver, pastor of the First Baptist church.

The introductory to the program, which contained the names of Mr. Davis and his cabinet, and a beautiful tribute to them, was read by Mrs. Walter J. Higgs.

The meeting was highly inspirational, and all came away with a profound regard, if possible, for the South, for its heroes and its traditions.
