# At Istanbul

#### All Colonization Work Is Halted; Official Denial Of Raid Refuted

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, June 20-The premises of the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA) in Istanbul have been closed down by the Turkish authorities and the activities of the organization have been stopped, according to a report today in Davar, Palestine Hebrew daily, from reliable sources in Turkey.

This report is in direct contradiction to an official communique issued by the Turkish authorities that no raid rad taken place on the association's headquarters in Istanbul. The communique was sent out by the Turkish Telegraphic Agency from Anatolia.

#### Avoid Palestine Advice

Jewish leaders in Palestine are greatly interested in the fate of the Jewish Colonization Association of fee in Turkey, since the raid was made on the charge that the Asso-ciation was allegedly encouraging Jewish emigration from Turkey in-to Palestine. Zionist activities in Turkey are prohibited. The Jewish Colonization Association there, in giving emigration advice to Jews, carefully avoided advice concerning Palestine.

The offices of the Jewish Colonization Association in Istanbul have been functioning in Turkey since many years before the World War as a branch of the central headquarters of the Association which are located in Paris.

Seizure of shipments of the Stuermer on German steamers by customs inspectors here has made it clear to the Nazi authorities in Germany that the United States frowns upon the publication. Sending of the Stuermer through American mails will also be suspended, it was learned yesterday.

## Huleh Building Refuses to Go Operations Set To Berlin On For Next Week Good Will Tour

#### Drainage of Palestine Major Cohen Withdraws From British Legion Delegation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, June 20—Major Brunel Cohen, treasurer of the British Le-gion, who was scheduled to go to Berlin as a member of the good-will party of British war veterans announced today that he will not join the delegation.

(1) He believes that his visit to ermany would be against the wish of the British Jews.

(2) He feels German Jews might resent the fact that a Jew from abroad is being entertained by the Nazi government.

(3) He is afraid that the German government may interpret his visit as an indication that the British Jews are favorably inclined towards the Hitler regime.

#### Hasn't Changed Faith, Prof. Bergson States

PARIS, June 20—Henri Bergson, 75-year-old internationally known philosopher, issued a state-ment today to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, denying categori-cally that he has embraced Catholicism.

The denial was issued in view of a report in the Nazi press stat-ing that Bergson had given up his Jewish religion. Prof. Berg-son, who is a member of the French Academy of Science, is still teaching in the College de France, despite his advanced age.

#### Advice Is Given by Max Warburg in Talk At Berlin

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20-The Jews in Germany were warned today not to depend too much on Jewish aid from abroad. The warning was given by Max Warburg, German-Jewish leader, addressing the annual meeting of the Hilfsverein, the German-Jewish relief organization which is helping Jews to migrate from Germany.

"The Jews of Germany must understand that there is no such thing as a Jewish financial or economic world organization," Mr. Warburg said. "The Jews from abroad are merely aiding Jewish migration from Germany as part of their charity activities."

Mr. Warburg emphasized that the Hilfsverein is ready to cooperate with the Zionists for the creation of a spiritual and economic basis for Jewish emigrants from Germany. The fate of German Jewry, he said, cannot be solved by the Hilfsverein, which is only an institution assisting prospective emi-grants against making false steps.

### Soviet Allows Jews To Hold 100 Acres For Own Use

Gewish Telegraphic Agency)
MOSCOW, June 20—The possession of land as private property
was permitted by the Soviet government today for Jews in Biro-Bidjan, the Jewish autonomous district in the Far East.

The decision to permit Jewish

settlers in Biro-Bidjan to own land as private property came as a result of a recommendation submit-ted by the Soviet authorities in the Far East, with the approval of the Communist Party there.

This startling decision, which is a deviation from fundamental Communist principles, is explained by, the fact that "the peculiar qualities May Own 100 Acres

The decision provides that each Jewish colonist in Biro-Bidjan, in addition to working on collective farms, is to be allowed:

(1) To obtain land as personal

property and for personal use, limited to an area of one hectare (the equivalent of 100 acres). The land which he obtains as private prop-erty will be in his possession for perpetual use, for which he will be given a State deed.

(2) The produce of this private land will belong to him personally

and not to the collective.
(3) In addition to the land, each colonist is also permitted to have in his personal possession two or three cows and calves, two to three sows and their litter, twenty to twenty-five sheep and goats, an un-limited number of poultry, and up to twenty bee-hives

Must Work on Collectives While owning private property, the Jewish colonists will also have

The decision does not specify whether the land given to Jewish collective farmers for private use will have to be bought by the indi-vidual colonists or whether it will be granted by the State from the root towitour, in the district vast territory in the district.

These discussions should be confined only to bringing about an understanding between Jews and Christians in our day, so that they should be able to understand each other and not make reproaches against each other on the basis of recriminations out of the historic past, such as the medieval persecution on the one hand and the appearance of Christ on the other.

"The international relations of

the Jews, in my opinion, constitute no obstacle to the love of the fatherno obstacle to the love of the lather-land. These relations, on the con-trary, may be an advantage to the fatherland in which the respective Jewish groups live, and this very often happens.

"I am of the opinion that the Jews can live freely not only in the Liberal, but also in the Christian states in the same way as Christians can in non-Christian states, like in Japan. I hope that a spiritual conciliation between Jews and ual conciliation between Jews and Christians will in the future be-come a fact, and I expect such a development as a result of the priority of spiritual values."

A Polish Tradition

The Polish government, young as it is, has a fine tradition with regard to the Jews of Poland: whenever she needs them, she utilizes them. Once she has utilized them, she sends them packing.

This tradition is again illustrated now when the Polish government has ordered the forced liquidation of the Anti-Nazi Boycott Committee established by the Jews of Poland, Having instigated Jewish leaders in Poland to establish this committee in the early days of the Nazi regime, the government of Poland now practically declares the existence of this Committee illegal

#### The Jews as Tools

One who knows the history of the Anti-Nazi Boycott Committee Poland also knows that the Polish government was not only instrumental in establishing this Committee, but that it actually utilized it for all kinds of anti-German propaganda abroad. Leaders of this Committee were sent to international Jewish gather-ings in Amsterdam, in Geneva and in other centers, with the distinct mission to pour as much oil as possible on the anti-Ger-man feelings of world Jewry. These leaders were made to feel by the Polish government that they were performing an impor-tant mission in the interests of the Polish Republic by their campaign against Nazi Germany.

All this was, of course, in the

when Poland feared Nazi ambitions for Danzig and Upper Silesia. Utilizing the Jews as the vanguard in its hostility against Germany, the Polish government favored the Anti-Nazi Boycott Committee as an instrument to oust Germany from the Polish market and considered the work this Committee as highly patriotic.

#### **Ruined for Patriotism**

The number of Jewish firms and business agents who had rep-resented German enterprises in Poland for generations and who were ruined by their desire to display their patriotism for Poland, is estimated at many thou-sands. They all severed their commercial relations with Germany, not so much because of the Jewish boycott, as because of their anxiety to satisfy the wish of the Polish government. Did the Polish government compensate them in any way for their patriotic action? Did it provide them with other concessions to make up their losses?

The Fire Raking Job The Polish government calmly observed how thousands of Jews were being ruined by the boycott, but it continued to stimulate it. The boycott was necessary to Polish diplomacy, and the Jews were their best tool.

Then the flirtation between Nazi Germany and the Polish government started; Goebbels paid a visit to Poland; a good-will mission of Nazi journalists proceeded to Warsaw; a ten-year non-aggression pact was signed; Poland became certain of its position in Danzig and Upper Silesia for at least another ten years, and there was no longer any need for anti-Nazi propaganda -- no longer need for raking fire with Jewish hands.

#### Jews No Longer Required

The stern devotion of the Polish government toward the Jew-ish Anti-Nazi Boycott Committee in Poland then suddenly began to cool off. The Jewish press was suddenly given to understand

#### Kerr Alien Bill Praised by Times

Under the headline "Sound Alien Policy," the New York Times carthe following editorial (re printed in part);

The bill introduced in the House by Representative Kerr of North Carolina and favorably reported by the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization seeks to remove anomalies. It vests limited discretionary pow ers on deportation of aliens in a committee consisting of repre-sentatives of the Departments of State, Justice and Labor. The committee may not intervene in behalf of aliens who are crimi-nals, dangerous radicals or immoral persons, but it may pre-vent the expulsion of aliens who entered the country irregularly and have been residents of good repute for a period of ten years or more.

The Kerr bill would also do away with an anomaly like the one which requires that student or tourist aliens who wish to become citizens must leave the country and re-enter.

Ludwig Lore, in his editorial col-umn in the New York Post, writes:

Mr. Avery Brundage went to Germany last year as representative of the American Athletic Union to investigate the sport situation in the Reich. On his return, he reported that Germany had wholly complied with America's conditions and that Jewish athletes would be given adequate opportunity to participate in the various events. The Jewish Telegraphic Agency now reports from Berlin that a new campaign has been started to prevent the admittance of Jews into German sports.

"No Jew should have the right to take athletic exercises in a German sport league," clamors a syndicated Nazi article published in National Socialist newspapers. "It must not happen again that German sports interests are represented by Jews as happened previously in tennis where Germany was represented by a Jew, Daniel Prenn." The N. Y. Times of June 15 tells that the Berliner Tennis Club, of which Dr. Prenn was a member, has been dis-solved, making it impossible for its members to participate in Olympic events

I am not so optimistic as to believe that the American Commission will reconsider its decision to participate in the Olympics for such "trivial reasons."

### Find London Has 145 Synagogues

Located in 29 Boroughs That Had None in 1904, Survey Reveals

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, June 20 - There are 145 synagogues out of a total of 4,722 houses of worship of all denominations in the Greater London area, according to an expert survey by Arthur Black, published here in the British Weekly.

Synagogues are now to be found

in twenty-nine boroughs or districts that had none in 1904 when a similar survey of church facilities was undertaken. At that time, when the area of London was not so large, there were sixty-three synagogues in the London area. Today, in the same area, there are

143. Between 1904 and the pres-Between 1904 and the present, while the number of churches in the area surveyed in 1904 increased only slightly, from 4,026 to 4,207, the number of synagogues more than doubled.

The growth in number of the synagogues is ascribed by the survey to the fact that the Jewish population which, thirty years ago was almost completely concentrated in the Bast-End, is spreading out Jows are establishing flusters. trated in the East-End, is spreading out. Jews are establishing fusi-nesses in favorable neighborhoods and moving into better houses and districts as fortune favors them, it is pointed out.

Several new synagogues are now under construction in outlying sec-tions of London which a few years ago had few Jewish residents.
