TELAVIV, Feb. II. (JTA) -- Fifteen persons received first aid treatment this reming as a result of several clashes between members of the Israel-Soviet Friends plague and various groups of Tel Aviv citienses who traned out to heckle the Communists and pro-Communists demonstrating in sympathy with the Soviet Union, where leating here was bombed Monday night.

A police expert, who yesterday was allowed to inspect the legation courtyard where the blast occurred, estimated that the bomb contained some six and one-half sends of explosives.

Israeli newspapers today received anonymous letters, obvicusly in a childish sersel, declaring that an organization of Jewish boys--"The Black Boot" had bombed its Soviet legation and would shortly treat the Czechoslowk legation in the same dather. The notes said that the warnings were "no laughing matter."

A local paper today stated that the Soviet Minister to Tel Aviv, Pavel Yershov, lad said that the bombing "outrage is a result of the anti-Soviet incitement cambines stated by the Izrael Government."

It was announced in Parliament today that a debate would be held next Monday on a Communist-Mapam motion calling for a vote of non-confidence in the Bert Gurion Gavenment because of the bombing of the Russian legation.

A resolution expressing the Zionist movement's "abborrence" of such terrorist actions as the bombing of the legation was adopted at a meeting of the Jewish Agency executive today. The executive also sent its best wishes for a speedy recovery to the persons injured in the explosion.

BRAEL AMBASSADOR RENEWS APPLICATION FOR MILITARY AID FROM U.S.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11. (JTA) -- Israel Ambassador Abbs Eban, accompanied by Israel Minister David Goltein, met today with the newly-appointed Under Secretary of State Walter Bedeil Smith and discussed matters concerning Israel and its relations with its Arab neighbors.

The Ambassador formally renewed Israel's application for military aid from the United States within the terms of the Mutual Security Act. The conversation lasted of minutes and, before his departure, the Ambassador left formal notes elaborating the main points discussed. He later said he "emerged with great confidence" from the conference.

U.N. RELIEF FOR ARAB REFUGEES DELIVERED BY ISRAEL TO EGYPT

TEL AVIV, Feb. 11. (JTA) -- A convoy of 20 trucks today transported 102 tons of foodstuffs from Haifa to the Egyptian border in the vicinity of Gasa where the food, owned by the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine refugees, was turned over to the Egyptians under the supervision of U. N. personnel.

The food comprised the entire cargo of the Egyptian vessel Samir apprehended is Israeli waters while en route from Gaza to Lebanon. The expense of the transsipment will be borne by UNRWA. The fate of the Egyptian sailing vessel depends to a decision of the Israeli courts.

COLLEGE FRATERNITY GETS WIDE SUPPORT FOR ACCEPTING JEW

ROSTON. Feb. II. (JTA) -- The suspension of the Williams College chapter of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity, a national organization with 115 chapters in the United States and Canada, for accepting a Jewish student as a member seemed today to be developing state-wide and national ramifications. The chapter was charged by the assignal body with violating a constitutional restriction against accepting members who are not white or of "full Aryan blood."

Ren Richard D. Caples of Boston has introduced a resolution in the Massachasetts legislature condemning the action of the national fraternity and asking the House to "applaud" the decision of the Williams College group. At Brown University, in Providence, R. L., the Phi Delta Theta chapter announced that it would also invite managing by accepting either a Negro or a Jewish student, although it had not

Dr. James P. Baxter 3rd, president of Williams College, has issued a statement declaring that there is an "understanding" at the school that in elections to fraternities and campus organizations the college's board of trustees "holds that each undergraduate should be accorded whatever recognition he merits as an indiridial according to his ability, achievement, personality and character."

In New York, Jacob Blaustein, president of the American Jewish Committee, said that the AJC commends "the Williams College chapter and the alumni members she supported by a three-quarter majority the action of the Chapter in pledging the Jewish student. This action marks a triumoh for democratic thinking on American campuses. The refusal of the Williams College Chapter of Phi Delta Theta to conform to the unjustified and archaic policy of their national organization is in the bishest tradition of Americanism."

BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY ANNOUNCES OPENING OF FIRST GRADUATE SCHOOL

WALTHAM, Mass., Feb. II. (JTA) -- The opening of the first graduate school # Brandeis University leading to advanced degrees in the Arts and Sciences was ansourced today by Dr. Abrain L. Sachar, president of the University. Courses of in-struction will begin in September, 1953. The school will offer instruction in chemisty, musical composition, Mar Eastern and Judaic studies, and psychology.

Degrees awarded by the Brandeis Graduate School of Arts and Sciences will be Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy in Near Eastern and Judaic Studies; Master Arts in Chemistry, Master of Fine Arts in Music Composition, and Doctor of Philosophy in Psychology. A number of graduate scholarships, graduate fellowships and teaching assistantships are being offered by the University, providing full remission of tuition and fees and stipends up to \$1,400. The awards will be made on a competitive basis to men and women candidates of distinguished academic potential.
