— COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS —

- Played in 43 career games (38 starts) during his five seasons at Kentucky (2023) and NC State (2019-22), completing 777-of-1,315 attempts for 9,553 yards and 87 TDs, while adding 6 rushing TDs...Finished with a 24-14 career record as a starter (17-9 at NC State, 7-6 at Kentucky)
- With Kentucky (2023), completed 209-of-371 passes (56.3 percent) for 2,746 yards and 25 TDs...His 25 passing TDs were the most by a UK QB since Andre' Woodson (2007)
- Left NC State ranked sixth in school history with 6,807 career passing yards and fourth in completion percentage (60.2%)

— PERSONAL —

- Writes left-handed, but throws with his right hand (because he used his right-handed brother's baseball glove as a kid)
- Competed in football, baseball, hockey, basketball and wrestling as a kid
- Brother, Donovan, is a QB at Illinois
- Participated in the Manning Passing Academy (2022-23)
- Participated in a three-day Navy Seals and Marine Corps training led by NC State head coach Dave Doeren
- Graduated from NC State with a degree in sport management in December 2022

2023: (KENTUCKY – 13/13)

- Started all 13 games in his one season with Kentucky, completing 209-of-371 passes for 2,746 yards, 25 TDs and 12 INTs...His 25 TD passes were one short of Top 5 in program history, marked the most by a UK QB since Andre' Woodson (2007) and ranked second in the SEC...Selected to play in the East-West Shrine Bowl
- Completed 16-of-28 passes for 306 yards, 2 TDs and 2 INTs in the Gator Bowl vs. Clemson (12/29), marking his third game in 2023 with 300+ passing yards and eighth game with 2+ passing TDs
- Completed 12-of-22 passes for 206 yards, 3 TDs and 1 INT in the 38-31 victory at Louisville (11/25)
- Completed 28-of-39 passes for 372 yards and 2 TDs vs. Tennessee (10/28)
- Completed 16-of-25 passes for 215 yards, 3 TDs and 1 INT in the 35-3 victory vs. Akron (9/16), becoming the 15th QB in school history to throw for at least 300 yards in a game...Also became the first UK QB with 3+ passing TDs in consecutive games since Mike Hartline (vs. Georgia 10/23/10; vs. South Carolina, 10/16/10)
- Completed 24-of-38 passes for 299 yards, 4 TDs and 1 INT in the 28-17 victory vs. Eastern Kentucky (9/9)

2022: (NC STATE – 6/6)

- Started in all six games he appeared in as a senior, completing 118-of-193 passes for 1,265 yards, 11 TDs and 4 INTs, before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury...NC State was 5-1 and ranked in the Top 15 of both The AP and Coaches' Poll at the time of his injury
- Completed 32-of-44 passes for 320 yards, 4 TDs and 1 INT vs. Connecticut (9/24)
- Completed 16-of-25 passes for 238 yards and 4 TDs in the 55-3 victory vs. Charleston Southern (9/10)

2021: (NC STATE – 12/12)

- Started all 12 games for the Wolfpack, completing 283-of-431 passes for 3,433 yards, 35 TDs and 5 INTs...His 35 TDs broke the NC State single-season record (QB Philip Rivers, 34 in 2003)...His 3,433 passing yards ranked sixth most in single-season school history, while his 65.7% completion percentage ranked third best...Became the first QB in ACC history to post at least 35 TDs and 5 or fewer INTs...Named NC State's winner of the Governor's MVP Award, the Ken McNeill Award for comeback from injury and the Torry Holt Award for Offensive MVP
- Completed 19-of-30 passes for 247 yards and 4 TDs in the season finale vs. North Carolina (11/25)

- Completed 17-of-24 passes for 303 yards and 2 TDs vs. Syracuse (11/20)
- Completed 37-of-59 passes for 408 yards (a season high), 4 TDs and 2 INTs at Wake Forest (11/13)...Became the only QB in school history to throw for 4+ TDs against five ACC opponents in the same season and the only player to throw for 4+ in three consecutive games
- Completed 21-of-32 passes for 214 yards, 4 TDs and 1 INT at Florida State (11/6)...Had thrown 228 consecutive passes without an INT – the third-longest streak in school history – before throwing a pick on a hail mary at the end of the half
- Completed 25-of-36 passes for 317 yards and 4 TDs vs. Louisville (10/30), a game in which he faced his now Ravens teammate, QB Malik Cunningham
- Completed 16-of-24 passes for 251 yards and 3 TDs in the 33-7 victory at Boston College (10/16)
- Completed 32-of-44 passes for 238 yards and 4 TDs in the double-OT victory vs. No. 9 Clemson (9/25), the Wolfpack's first win against the Tigers in nine games...In OT, Leary completed 73.7% of his throws including 2 TD passes
- Completed 23-of-29 passes for 259 yards and 3 TDs, while adding 7 rushing yards in the 45-7 win vs. Furman (9/18)

2019: (NC STATE – 8/5)

- Played in eight games (five starts) as a redshirt freshman, completing 101-of-210 passes for 1,219 yards, 8 TDs and 5 INTs...Became the first redshirt freshman QB to start a game at NC State since Russell Wilson (2008)
- Completed 24-of-44 passes for 243 yards, 2 TDs and 1 INT, while adding a season-high 23 yards on the ground vs. Louisville (11/16)
- Posted season highs in passing yards (259) and passing TDs (3) while coming in off the bench in that game at Boston College (10/19)

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Attended Timber Creek Regional (Sicklerville, NJ) HS, where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter for head coach Rob Hinson...Completed 566-of-910 passes for 9,672 yards and 117 TDs, while also rushing for 525 yards and 11 TDs...Helped lead the Chargers to an impressive 46-5 record during his four seasons, including victories in the 2016 and 2017 state championships...Finished his prep career as New Jersey's all-time leader in passing yards (9,672) and passing TDs (117)
- Named the Gatorade Player of the Year in New Jersey as both a junior and senior
- Earned his team's MVP award in three consecutive seasons
- Also played baseball (2015-16)

2020: (NC STATE – 4/3)

- Appeared in four games (three starts), completing 66-of-110 passes for 890 yards, 8 TDs and 2 INTs, before suffering a season-ending injury vs. Duke (10/17)
- Completed 28-of-44 passes for a then-career-high 336 yards and 4 TDs in the 30-29 victory at Pittsburgh (10/3), earning him a place on the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List and a Manning Award Star of the Week honor...Completed 6-of-9 passes for 74 yards on the final, game-winning drive, capped by a 13-yard TD pass with 0:23 seconds left on the clock...Became the first Wolfpack QB with 330+ passing yards, 4 passing TDs and 0 INTs in a game since Russell Wilson (2009)



— LEARY'S COMMUNITY IMPACT —

- Visited the St. Paul's School for an afternoon of fellowship and fun with Next One Up...Rookies and students were divided into three groups, rotating between kickball, silent charades and "anything but football" conversations (2024)
- Participated in the organization-wide Signature Build Day at Samuel Coleridge-Taylor Elementary School...Throughout the day, close to 200 volunteers made up of current and former Ravens players, staff and executives refurbished the school's gymnasium, classrooms, teachers' lounges and hallways...Additionally, volunteers renovated the playground and outdoor courtyard, planted trees and painted outdoor murals to enhance landscaping and enrich the school community (2024)
