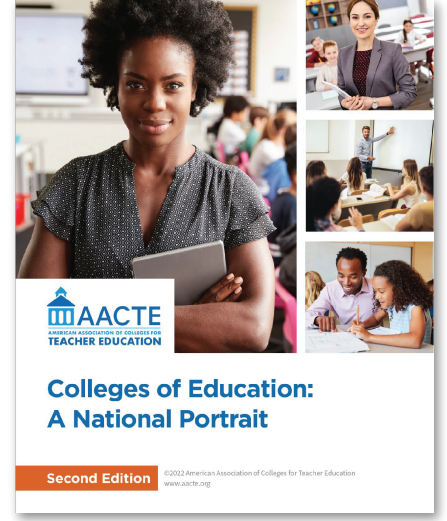


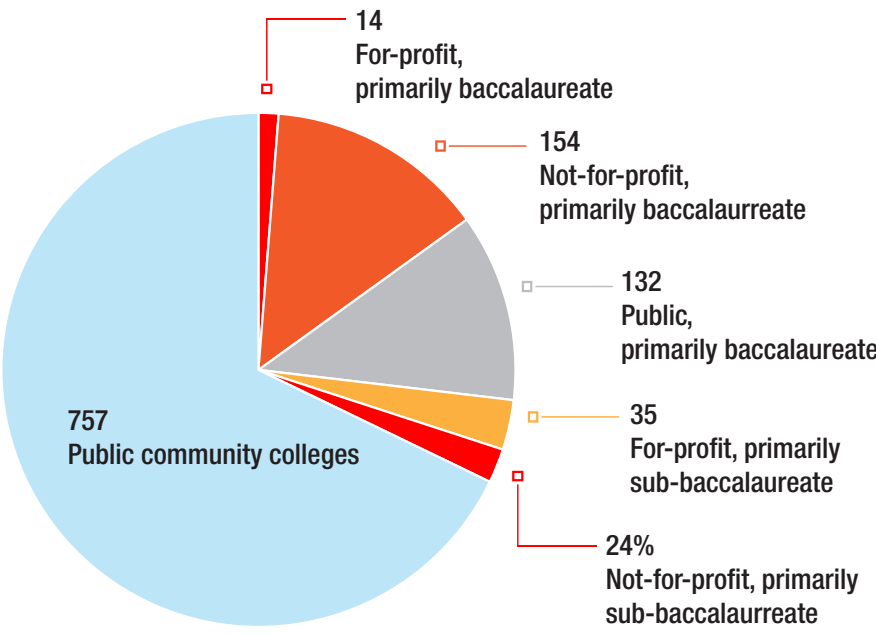
Colleges of Education: A National Portrait Second Edition

Institutions Awarding Associate's Degrees and Sub-Baccalaureate Certificates in Education

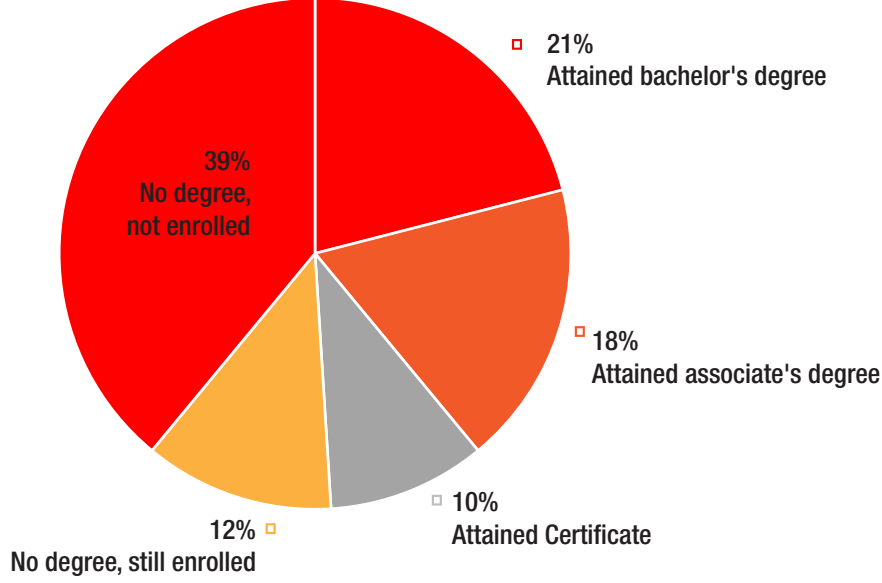


Community colleges award 81% of 30,000 associate's degrees and sub-baccalaureate certificates in education.

52% of the education degrees and certificates conferred by community colleges are in early childhood education.

38% of students majoring in education at four-year institutions had previously attended a community college.

Degree Outcomes of Community College Education Students



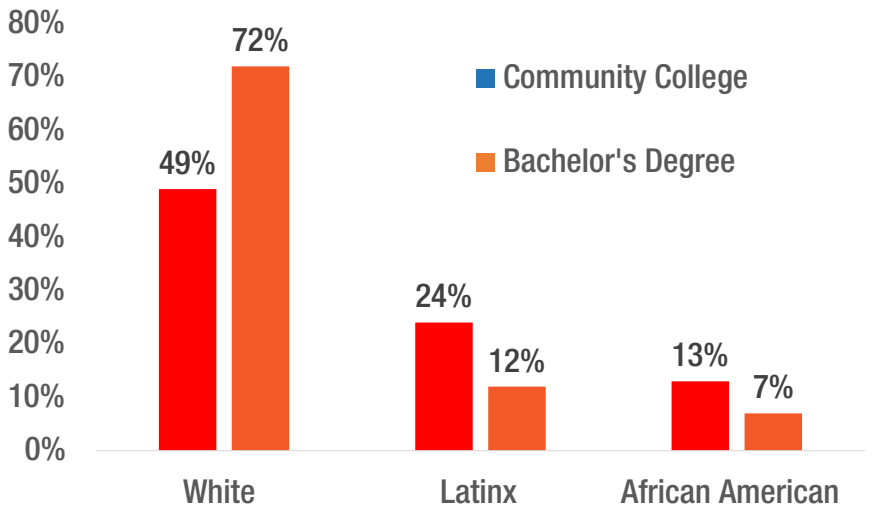
1/2 of community college education students are age 24 or older.

60% are financially independent.

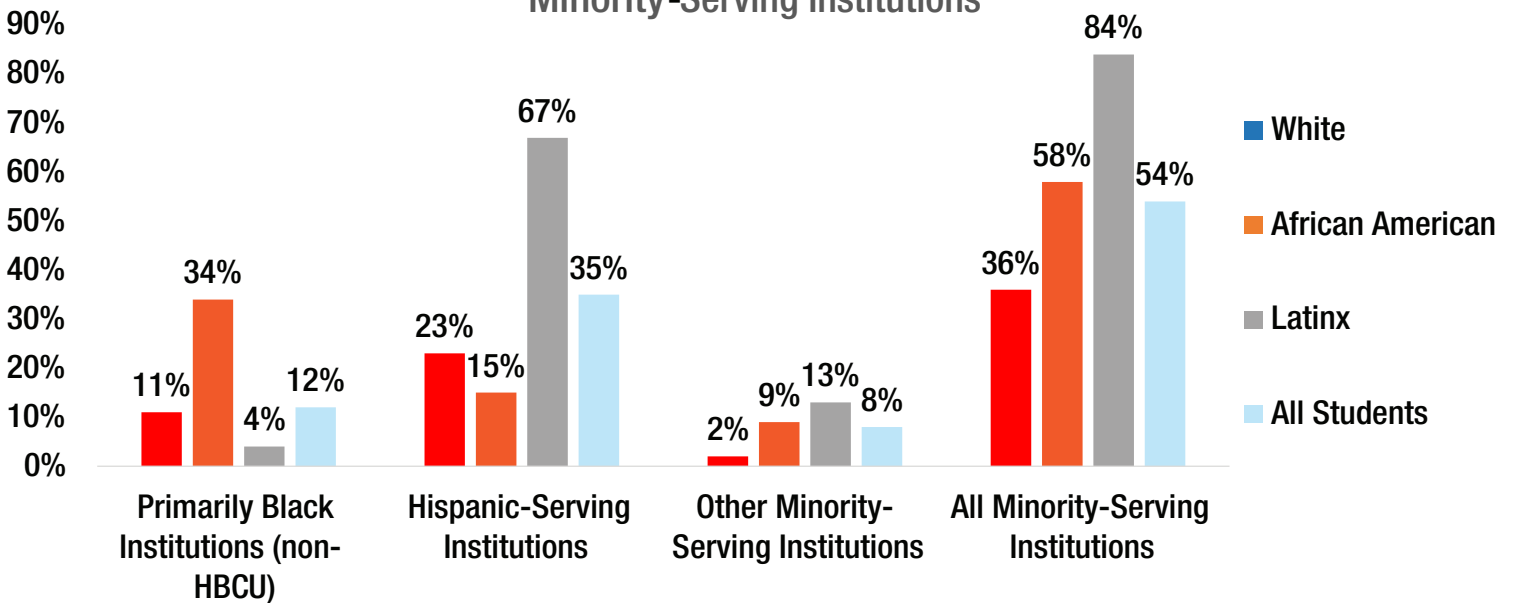
34% have children and 18% of are single parents.
