## SPRING ADMIT PRE-APPROVAL FORM

Newly admitted spring students who have submitted a commitment deposit can use this form to request evaluation of courses they wish to take at another university or college in the semester before entering USC. The evaluation of each course will appear on your **Transfer Credit Report**, which you can view on OASIS through <u>my.usc.edu</u> after you have been granted access.

USC has extensive <u>articulation agreements</u> with many California community colleges. These agreements comprise a set list of courses and how they will transfer to USC. If the school you are attending appears on an articulation agreement, you should **NOT** submit this form.

This form is not valid for current USC students, applicants or students who have not paid a commitment deposit. This form is **NOT** to be used to determine credit for courses you have already taken.

Please remember to review the transfer policies and other information outlined in the <u>Course Planning Worksheet</u> and on the <u>Student Development Programs</u> website before you sign and date this page. Submit this form to Student Development Programs at <u>sdpesd@usc.edu</u>.

To ensure that you can enroll in time for the fall semester, we recommend you submit this form in **June or July 2024**. We will not process forms submitted after August 31, 2024. Please request ONLY the courses that you have registered for or intend to register for.

#### **Courses Taken Abroad**

Study-abroad programs offered through U.S. colleges and universities are evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Credit for study-abroad courses may be different from that granted for courses taken within the U.S. Indicate on page 2 of this form any courses that will be taken abroad and be sure to provide information about the program, a course syllabus, and state which university will provide the transcript for the course(s). Please attach additional pages as necessary. **Programs offered through international institutions cannot be evaluated in advance.** 

Please note that U.S.-accredited schools are exempt from this policy. This includes but is not limited to: American University of Paris; Franklin University Switzerland; Richmond, The American International University in London; John Cabot University; Anglo-American University.

### Distance Education Courses Offered to Any Student (Instructional TV, Online, Hybrid, etc.)

Distance-learning, online courses, concentrated "intensive" sessions, special weekend modules, and other nontraditional course formats and time frames will be considered by petition, and credit is granted on a case-by-case basis. Be sure to keep copies of course syllabi, exams and papers, as we may ask for these in making our determination. Please note that elective units only—not equivalence to USC courses or fulfillment of requirements—are granted for foreign language and laboratory science courses taught via distance learning, TV or in an online or correspondence course.
