GYMBACK NOTABLES

Razorbacks on the Rise

Arkansas is boosted this year by a strong contingent of returners and a talented freshman class. Four-time All-American Kennedy Hambrick enters her senior year fresh off an NCAA Championships appearance and as the new Arkansas all-around record holder with a score of 39.750. Maggie O'Hara is back for her final season as well. O'Hara became Arkansas' first-ever bars regular season All-American with a national qualifying score of 9.925 and advanced the NCAA Championships, where she finished in fourth place for another set of All-American honors. Bailey Lovett and Sarah Shaffer also return and can contribute solidly throughout Arkansas' lineups.

Leah Smith, the 2021 Nastia Liukin Cup winner, 2021 national floor champion, and five-time Texas state champion, is expected to make an immediate impact for Arkansas, and fellow rookies Makie Sedlacek and Cami Weaver could also be big players in their rookie seasons.

Gybacks Ranked 11th in WCGA Preseason Poll

The Arkansas gymnastics program has been ranked No. 11 heading into the 2022 slate in the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) preseason poll.

The Gybacks have fallen in the Top 20 in the preseason poll for the last 16 years and move up four spots from last season's No. 15 rank. The climb speaks to the success of head coach Jordyn Wieber, who has taken the team from a No. 19 preseason rank in 2019 to No. 11 in 2021.

The team was ranked as high as No. 4 overall last year and was the second-best team in the nation on floor exercise in four weeks over the season. Arkansas set a new program record score of 197.350 against Missouri only to break it two meets later with a 197.425 at Auburn. The team scored a 197.250 in the first round of its 17th-straight regional appearance, the highest-ever in regional competition.

TV Schedule, Times Announced For 2022 Gymnastics Season

The Arkansas Gybacks will have four regular season meets broadcast on national television when the team returns to action in January.

The SEC and ESPN announced its gymnastics television coverage on Thursday, which includes 24 meets and the return of the network's "Friday Night Heights" franchise, along with simulcasts on SEC Network+.

Arkansas' second meet of the regular season, which is also the first-ever to be hosted in Bud Walton Arena, will be televised on SEC Network at 7:30 p.m. CT. The Gybacks take on the Auburn Tigers in what is the kickoff to their SEC schedule.

The Razorbacks return to national television the following Friday, Jan. 21, as Arkansas hits the road for a dual meet at LSU. SEC Network coverage will broadcast live at 8 p.m.

Arkansas will be on SEC Network for the third week in a row on Jan. 28 for the Gybacks' away contest in Gainesville against Florida. The meet is set for 7:30 p.m. Arkansas' home finale and Senior Night against Georgia on Feb. 25 will be featured the SEC Network and will air live at 8 p.m.

The remainder of Arkansas' home meets against Ohio State on Jan. 7, West Virginia on Feb. 4 and Kentucky on Feb. 11 will be streamed live via SEC Network+.

Both sessions of the SEC Championships on March 19 will air live on SEC Network, while ESPN will host footage of NCAA Championship action.

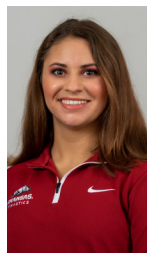

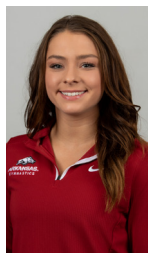

Arkansas Gymnastics Adds Five for 2023 Season

Head coach Jordyn Wieber has announced the official signings of five gymnasts to join the Arkansas program. Jaime Pratt, Cally Swaney, Lauren Williams, Reese Drotar and Morgan Price will join the Gymnastics on The Hill for the 2023 season.

Jaime Pratt

Jaime Pratt, an Abbotstown, Pennsylvania, native, has been competing Level 10 at Hanover Gymnastics since 2017. Most recently, Jaime reached the podium on all events at the 2021 Region 7 Regional meet with a bronze on beam and golds on vault, bars, floor and in the all-around. Her 38.375 all-around score, 9.800 bars score and 9.775 floor score from regionals are all personal bests. At Development Team Nationals, Pratt placed within the top five on bars and floor and claimed the all-around bronze with a score of 38.125.

Cally Swaney

Cally Swaney hails from Gastonia, NC and competes with First in Flight Gymnastics. Swaney was crowned the North Carolina state champion this year on vault and beam and took the all-around title as well with a personal high score of 38.525. Swaney was also the 2021 Region 8 champion on vault. At nationals in May, Swaney placed within the top 10 on bars and floor and came in ninth all-around. Swaney will graduate from Stuart W. Cramer High School in the spring.

Lauren Williams

The Gymnastics will add local talent to the roster next season when Lauren Williams arrives on campus. Williams is a Rogers, Ark. product who currently attends Bentonville High School and competes at Aspire Gymnastics. Williams will be the first local recruit to come through the Arkansas program since Amanda Siebert, a Springdale native who competed for the Razorbacks from 2010 to 2012. Williams was the Arkansas state champion on vault and floor in 2019 and she placed third all-around. Williams also qualified to JO Nationals in 2019, in which she tied for 10th on vault and also placed 10th on floor. Lauren will follow in the footsteps of her mother as a Razorback, as Theresa was a diver at Arkansas.

Reese Drotar

Reese Drotar trains at Airborne Gymnastics Center and is from Los Gatos, Calif. Reese has been competing Level 10 since 2018 and claimed the all-around title at the 2020 Pacific Classic with a score of 37.025. Reese also took the bars crown at the Pacific Classic with a score of 9.800, which is a career high and a mark that placed her on the America's Top 100 list in 2020 on bars from My Meet Scores. After graduation from Los Gatos High School, Reese will join her older brother in Fayetteville, as he's currently a student at Arkansas.

Morgan Price

Morgan Price joined the 2023 signing class on Thanksgiving Day and brings even more excitement and talent to the group of five. Price, a Coppell, Texas native, holds 2021 Texas state titles in each of the four events and in the all-around, won three events and the all-around at regionals and took third all-around at nationals in May of 2021. Price, who will graduate early to join the Gymnastics, is also the younger sister of current Arkansas freshman Frankie Price.

Hano Promoted to Assistant Coach

Felicia Hano, a decorated collegiate gymnast at UCLA and former United States senior national team member, has been promoted to assistant coach, Arkansas head coach Jordyn Wieber announced Friday.

Hano, who joined the Razorback gymnastics program in the fall of 2020 as a volunteer assistant coach, replaces Catelyn Orel, who was named the head coach at Lindenwood University. Hano will continue to assist with the vault and floor performers as well as collaborate with the Razorback social media and creative content teams.

Hano helped lead Arkansas to its 17th consecutive NCAA regional appearance (no postseason competition held in 2020) this past season as the Razorbacks earned the No. 10 overall seed. The Gymnastics set the program record for team total score on two occasions during the regular season, including a school-best 197.425 in the win at No. 12 Auburn.

She also assisted in the development of Maggie O'Hara (first-team bars) and Kennedy Hambrick (second-team vault, bars, beam and all-around), who earned All-America honors after their performances the 2020 NCAA Gymnastics Championship.

Prior to joining the Gymnastics staff, Hano capped an outstanding career at UCLA as a four-time All-Pac-12 honoree (first-team vault and floor in 2019, second-team floor in 2018 and 2020) and six-time All-American (four times on vault and twice on floor). The San Gabriel, Calif., native was a member of the 2018 NCAA National Championship team and scored her first career perfect 10 on the floor against Oklahoma that season to help spur the Bruins to their title run.

Hano, who was the 2019 Pac-12 vault co-champion, competed in the all-around in the final five meets of the pandemic-shortened 2020 season - her last at UCLA. She finished the year with the second-highest average score among her Bruin teammates on both the vault (9.900) and floor (9.950).

Before beginning her collegiate career at UCLA, Hano was a member of the 2014-15 U.S. senior national team. She competed alongside three of Wieber's "Fierce Five" teammates - Gabby Douglas, Aly Raisman and Kyla Ross - as well as one of the most dominant gymnasts of all time, Simone Biles.

Hano graduated from UCLA in the spring of 2020 with a bachelor's degree in political science.

ROSS JOINS STAFF AS VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT

The Gymnastics also bolstered the coaching staff for 2021 with the addition of Kyla Ross as a volunteer assistant coach. Ross, a 2012 Olympic gold medalist and 11-time UCLA All-American, comes to Arkansas after one season as an undergraduate assistant coach for the Bruins, which followed a historic career as a student-athlete.

Ross and Wieber have a decorated history as members of the "Fierce Five" squad that won team gold at the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. The two also spent several years at UCLA together while Wieber served as a team manager and volunteer assistant coach and Ross competed on the team, from 2016 to 2019.

While finishing her undergraduate degree in molecular, cell and developmental biology, Ross served as an undergraduate assistant coach at UCLA for the 2020-21 season. She helped lead the Bruins to the regional final, and six gymnasts received All-Pac-12 honors.

Before beginning her coaching journey, Ross cemented herself as one of the most successful gymnasts in NCAA history - from her collegiate debut against Arkansas in 2017, to her final meet in 2020. She won NCAA titles in each season that the championships were held during her career (canceled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic) with one on each event, in addition to UCLA's team first place finish in 2018. This made Ross the first female gymnast to hold Olympic, World and NCAA titles. She's also a two-time Pac-12 all-around, uneven bars and team champion, and she won the 2017 and 2019 Pac-12 beam and floor titles, respectively.

Ross tallied 22 Perfect 10s in her collegiate tenure, which includes two Gym Slams: a 10 on each event. She's one of just 11 gymnasts to achieve a Gym Slam, and the first to record two in the same year (2019). Her 11 uneven bars perfect scores are an NCAA best, and she also holds records for 10s in consecutive meets (10 in 2019) and most in one season (14 in 2019).

Ross was the 2020 recipient of the Honda Sports Award, given to the best female collegiate athlete in her sport, and was named Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year in 2019 and 2020.

With the addition of Ross, each member of Arkansas' coaching staff is a former national team member (Wieber, assistant coach Chris Brooks and assistant coach Felicia Hano), three are world team members and Olympians (Ross, Wieber and Brooks), and two are Olympic gold medalists (Ross and Wieber).

Barnhill Arena officially closed its doors as a basketball facility on March 3, 1993. Barnhill was reconfigured into the largest volleyball-only arena in time for the 1994 season. It then underwent a second significant face-lift prior to the 2003 season to also become the home of Arkansas gymnastics.

MEET ONE VS OHIO STATE JANUARY 7, 2022

JORDYN WIEBER

THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH

Olympic gold medalist Jordyn Wieber was introduced as the head coach of the Arkansas Women's Gymnastics program on Wednesday, April 24, 2019, by Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Hunter Yurachek.

In her first year, Arkansas scored a 49.00 or higher in 14 of 16 events over the course of four home meets, nearly 90 percent of all events. Wieber has coached three regular-season All-Americans in Sophia Carter (2020), Maggie O'Hara (2021) and Kennedy Hambrick (2020, 2021). Under Wieber, the Razorbacks have set an all-time attendance record, all-time team score (197.425 at Auburn on March 5, 2021) and Hambrick became the new all-around score record holder with an impressive 39.750 vs Missouri on Feb. 19, 2021.

In the post-season, the Gymnastics team earned their first-ever spot in the SEC night session and advanced to the second day of NCAA Regionals after scoring a post-season program best 197.250 on day one. In total, Arkansas registered fives scores of 197.000 or better in 2021 for the first time in program history.

In 2020, the Gymnastics team ranked as high as fourth in the nation on floor and finished the season ninth in the nation. It was against No. 13 Kentucky on Jan. 24 that Arkansas scored a 49.525 on the floor, the second-highest event total in program history. Headed into 2022, Arkansas is holding onto the third-longest active streak for meets with a score of 49.000 or higher, coming in with 32 straight meets, behind Alabama (33) and Florida (35).

The Razorbacks' success on the floor helped them lock in back-to-back SEC wins against No. 20 Missouri and No. 10 Georgia mid-way through the season. The consecutive wins marked the first time since 2017 that Arkansas won two-straight conference meets and consecutive meets against a ranked opponent.

During her first season at the helm, Wieber coached two regular-season All-Americans in Sophia Carter and Kennedy Hambrick. Carter finished the season ranked 11th on the floor while Hambrick closed out her sophomore campaign ranked 16th in the all-around. Arkansas saw six Gymnastics athletes wrap up the season ranked in the top 100 by Road to Nationals in at least one event, with four Hogs finishing with multiple top 100 rankings. With Wieber's lead, Arkansas won 27 event titles through 10 meets. Hambrick finished the season with the most individual titles among the Gymnastics athletes, securing 11 event titles including a team-high four all-around titles.

The first home meet of the Wieber era was held on Jan. 17 against No. 3 Denver, bringing a record crowd of 6,714 fans to Barnhill Arena. On Feb. 21, Coach Wieber and her Arkansas squad hosted Auburn for a Women's Empowerment Meet, the first of its kind in NCAA gymnastics. 5,224 fans gathered at Barnhill Arena for Women's Empowerment Night, the ninth highest attendance in program history, making it the third top-10 attendance for 2020 alone. All-in-all, 21,661 fans saw the Gymnastics team in action in Barnhill in 2020. The average attendance of 5,415 fans per meet is a program record, approximately 2,400 more than the 2019 average and over 1,000 more than the previous record, set in year two (2004), when an average of 4,401 Gymnastics fans attended each meet. The Razorbacks finished ninth in the nation for average attendance, making it the ninth time Arkansas finished the season ranked in the top-10 for attendance.

Beyond the gym, Wieber has served as an outspoken advocate for victims of child sexual abuse. Wieber has used the platform of gymnastics to encourage and inspire generations of young girls and others around the nation.

Wieber is a familiar name in the gymnastics community after a prolific career as a competitor, including earning a gold medal as part of Team USA in the 2012 Olympics. After finishing her competitive career, Wieber served as an assistant for legendary UCLA coach Valorie Kondos Field, helping lead the Bruins to the 2018 NCAA Championship.

Wieber coached the Bruins on floor exercise, an event in which UCLA finished the 2018 and 2019 regular seasons ranked No. 1 in the nation. In 2019, the Bruins recorded scores of 49.5 or better in 11 of 14 meets, averaging a national-best 49.604 on floor. UCLA hit a season-high 49.825 on March 16, which ranks No. 3 all-time in school history, behind five scores of 9.925 or better in that meet, including two perfect 10s. The floor squad also posted marks of 49.775 (March 23) and 49.750 (Feb. 16) over the course of the year, as four Bruins earned regular season All-America honors in the event - Katelyn Ohashi, Kyla Ross, Gracie Kramer and Felicia Hano.

At the NCAA Championships on April 19-20, 2019, Wieber coached Ross to the individual floor title with a score of 9.950, the program's second in as many years after Ohashi took home the crown in 2018. After winning their semifinal session with a 197.650 (49.6125 in the floor), UCLA finished third overall in the finals.

The 2018 Bruins scored 49.4 or higher in 11 meets and 49.6 or higher in three meets, including a national season-high of 49.775 set Feb. 25. She and her fellow UCLA coaches were named the 2018 West Region Assistant Coaches of the Year, as they helped lead the Bruins to Pac-12, NCAA regional and NCAA national titles.

Wieber, who has been a vocal advocate for safe sport, has won several awards over the past few years, including the Arthur Ashe Courage Award at the ESPYs, the Rising Star Award by the Los Angeles Business Journal, and the Giant Steps A Hero Among Us Award.

A member of the "Fierce Five" United States squad that won team gold at the 2012 Olympics, Wieber was a two-time U.S. all-around champion (2011 and 2012) and the 2011 World all-around champion. Her illustrious Elite career included three medals (all-around and team gold, beam bronze) at the 2011 World Championships, four U.S. senior national titles (all-around, bars and floor in 2011 and all-around in 2012). She was also the 2008 U.S. junior all-around, vault and floor exercise champion and the American Cup all-around champion in 2009, 2011 and 2012. She dominated the competition at the 2010 Pacific Rim Championships, winning four gold medals (all-around, uneven bars, floor exercise, team) and one silver (vault). In her first international competition at the 2007 Junior Pan American Championships, she won gold medals on uneven bars and balance beam, silver in the all-around and bronze on floor exercise. Wieber officially retired from competitive gymnastics in 2015.

Wieber, from DeWitt, Mich., graduated from UCLA in 2017 with a degree in Psychology. She was a 2016 inductee into the Greater Lansing Sports Hall of Fame, a 2021 Michigan Sports Hall of Fame Inductee and is also a member of the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2012 U.S. Olympic team.
