## GYMBACK NOTABLES

### Gymbacks Ranked No. 15 In Preseason Poll

For the fourth consecutive season and fourth under head coach Jordyn Wieber, the Arkansas Razorback gymnastics team has landed in the top 15 of the Women's College Gymnastics Association preseason poll. The Gymbacks closed out their 2023 slate at their 19th straight regional, where they finished with a new regional team score record of 197.275, and a new regional floor record of 49.500. The team just missed the regional final and came in at 17th in the country, maintaining the program's 18-year streak in the top 20. Arkansas was represented at nationals, though, as graduate transfer Norah Flatley and freshman Lauren Williams both earned berths to the NCAA Championships as individuals, extending Wieber's unblemished national appearance streak in each eligible year. The Gymbacks hit multiple other milestones in the postseason which include SEC Championships team score record (196.825), SEC Championships vault record (49.425) and SEC Championships bars record (49.175). Five Gymbacks earned All-SEC or All-SEC Freshman honors at the meet: Norah Flatley (VT, FX, AA), Lauren Williams (VT, FX), Reese Drotar (UB), Frankie Price (VT) and Cami Weaver (VT), which is the most since 2018 and second-most ever for Arkansas. In the regular season, Arkansas saw a new program score record of 197.475 against LSU on Jan. 27, a new program vault record of 49.525 against Kentucky on Feb. 17, and a new program beam record of 49.525 against Missouri on Feb. 24. Arkansas posted five scores above 197 for the second time in program history in the 2023 slate, the first in 2021, also under Wieber. The Gymbacks have a star lineup of returners this year including Frankie Price, Jensen Scalzo, Leah Smith, Cami Weaver and Lauren Williams. Arkansas also added beam All-American Sirena Linton from Arizona as a graduate transfer, and their four freshmen - Chandler Buntin, Dakota Essenpries, Hailey Klein and Priscilla Park - provide a boost on all events.

### Roberson, Drexler Highlight Star Signing Class For Gymbacks

Arkansas gymnastics has bolstered its roster for the next four seasons with high-level talent as five new Gymbacks put pen to paper and solidified their commitments on Wednesday. Joscelyn Roberson, Grace Drexler, Ja'Leigh Lang, Sadie Smith and Julianna Weeks are set to join the Gymbacks in 2025 and provide a variety of experience and skill for the squad. "We are thrilled to have this group of incredibly talented young women join the Arkansas Gymnastics family. The excitement we feel to have Arkansas' first US National Team Member and World champion in Joscelyn Roberson and an All-Around National Champion in Grace Drexler, along with the other incredibly talented level 10s in this signing class, is undeniable," head coach Jordyn Wieber said. "Power, confidence, competitiveness, and passion are things that this class has in common. Each of them come from nationally-recognized clubs, great families, and will undoubtedly help us continue the growth of Arkansas Gymnastics within the NCAA."

#### Joscelyn Roberson - World Champions Centre - Texarkana, Texas

Joscelyn Roberson will make history on The Hill as the first-ever national team member and world champion to compete for the Razorbacks. Roberson is coached by Cecile and Laurent Landi at World Champions Centre in Spring, Texas, alongside gymnastics greats and Olympians Simone Biles and Jordan Chiles. WCC is also the former home gym of Gymback Leah Smith. In her two seasons as a senior elite, Roberson has earned 10 medals in national competitions, four gold, and 11 international medals, all either first or second place finishes.

#### Grace Drexler - Twin City Twisters - Stratford, Wis.

Drexler brings three years of level 10 experience to Fayetteville. She has competed at Twin City Twisters since 2018, the home gym to many NCAA standouts such as Maggie Nichols, Olivia Trautman and Grace McCallum. Drexler has qualified to nationals the last two seasons and brought home the all-around crown in 2022, along with a first place finish on floor.

#### Ja'Leigh Lang - San Mateo Gymnastics - East Palo Alto, Calif.

Ja'Leigh Lang has competed level 10 at San Mateo Gymnastics for the last two seasons. The East Palo Alto, Calif. native is the reigning national vault champion, all-around silver medalist, and came in fourth on bars. In 2022, Lang was the regional and California state vault champion, and took the state crown on floor. She is also a two-time California state bars silver medalist, placing second in 2022 and 2023.

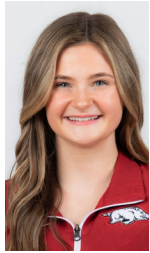

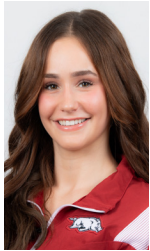

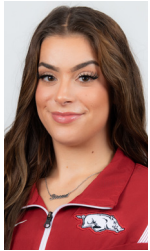

Sadie Smith - Ascend Gymnastics - Gig Harbor, Wash. Sadie Smith has competed level 10 for the last two seasons, most recently at Ascend Gymnastics in Washington, which was named the 2022 National Program of the Year by USA Gymnastics. Smith posted top five finishes in all events and all-around at regionals this past spring, with a bronze medal on bars. She was a 2022 national qualifier, where she finished in the top 15 on bars, and was also the 2022 regional third place finisher on bars. At the 2022 Washington state meet, Sadie placed in the top 10 on all events and all-around, including fifth on bars.

Julianna Weeks - Everest Gymnastics - Charlotte, N.C. Julianna Weeks has trained at Everest Gymnastics since 2021 and made her level 10 debut this season. Despite dealing with injuries over the past couple of seasons, she placed within the top 10 in both of her events at this season's Sand Dollar Invitational, coming in sixth on bars and ninth on vault. In her last North Carolina State meet appearance in 2021, Weeks finished in the top 10 on bars.

### Eight Gymbacks Earn Scholar All-American Status

Arkansas gymnastics' hard work in the classroom this past season is paying off as eight Razorbacks were named Scholar All-Americans by the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association on Thursday. Reese Drotar, Norah Flatley, Kalyxta Gamiao, Maddie Jones, Emma Kelley, Jensen Scalzo, Cally Swaney and Lauren Williams all received the honor, given to athletes who have earned cumulative GPAs of 3.5 or above, or 3.5 or above in the 2022-23 academic year. At least half of the team has earned Scholar All-America status in each of head coach Jordyn Wieber's four seasons, and Arkansas has received 45 total Scholar All-American honors in her tenure. The Hogs finished the year with a 3.39 team GPA, which comes in fourth among SEC teams. Arkansas also had 10 athletes make the SEC Winter Honor Roll and all four of its 2023 freshman receive SEC First Year Honor Roll honors to round out the team's academic plaudits for the season.

### Arkansas Gymnastics Adds Kyla Bryant As Assistant Coach

The Arkansas gymnastics staff continues to get stronger as the program has added All-American and Pac-12 champion Kyla Bryant as an assistant coach. "Kyla Bryant is the perfect addition to our coaching staff. She brings energy and competitive fire that is contagious and those that know her, love her," head coach Jordyn Wieber said. "She is wholeheartedly bought in to our mission of increasing national competitiveness and helping our student-athletes develop in the classroom and in the gym." Bryant competed at Stanford from 2018 to 2022 and had great success over the course of five seasons. She finished her run in Palo Alto with 61 career event titles, five All-Pac 12 honors (three on floor, two all-around), and as the 2021 Pac-12 floor champion. She was a two-time AAI Award nominee, known as the Heisman Trophy of NCAA women's gymnastics, and was a finalist in 2022. In her fifth year, Bryant earned 12 of the Cardinal's 20 individual event titles on the year, with at least one on each event and two all-around. She had Stanford's best score on each event and all-around in 2022, and earned career highs on vault (9.925), beam (9.975), and all-around (39.675). Bryant's collegiate career culminated at NCAA Championships in 2022, where she competed as an individual on floor. She scored 9.9375, a Stanford program record, and tied for seventh place, which earned her first team All-American honors. Bryant never scored below a 9.900 on floor in the 2022 slate. As a senior in 2021, Bryant became Stanford's first Pac-12 champion since 2018 with a title on floor after she scored a 9.950 at the conference championship. This extended a streak of excellence on the event dating back to her freshman year, and she earned Pac-12 floor honors in each season of her

collegiate career. "I want to begin by saying what an honor it is to hold this position. I am humbled, grateful and excited to say the least," Bryant said. "I want to thank Jordyn and the rest of the Razorback gymnastics community and staff for believing in me and for granting me the privilege to be a part of the University of Arkansas family. I am fired up and ready to get to work. God bless and Woo Pig!" Bryant graduated from Stanford with a degree in Science, Technology and Society in 2021 and received the Spirit of Stanford award in 2022. She was also a cofounder and president of CardinalBLACK, an organization dedicated to providing "a safe space for Black student-athletes to connect, share, and foster a meaningful community," and served as Stanford's liaison for the Pac-12's Gymnasts for Peace, Action and Change committee in 2021. She joins the staff as a third assistant along with Chris Brooks and Kyla Ross.

### Jordyn Wieber Signs New Agreement

Following a successful 2023 campaign that featured record-breaking individual and team scores, meet and season attendance records and yet another trip to the NCAA Gymnastics Regionals, University of Arkansas Head Gymnastics Coach Jordyn Wieber has signed a new employment agreement that positions her to stay at the helm of the GymBacks through the 2028 season. "Since arriving in Fayetteville, Jordyn Wieber has continued to elevate our gymnastics program within the Southeastern Conference and nationally," Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Hunter Yurachek said. "In the past four seasons, our program has qualified for NCAA competition each season, achieved numerous program records and produced multiple All-Americans. The success of our program has also fostered the growth of gymnastics throughout our state. From a sold-out Barnhill Arena to record-setting crowds at Bud Walton Arena, it is evident that the excitement for Razorback Gymnastics has never been higher. I look forward to seeing what is next on the horizon for Razorback Gymnastics under Coach Wieber's leadership." The new three-year agreement runs from July 1, 2023 to April 30, 2026 and includes a series of scheduled salary increases and up to two one-year agreement extensions based on NCAA Gymnastics Regional appearances. Additional incentive payments will be based on the team's success in SEC and NCAA competition, the graduation rate of gymnastics student-athletes as well as the recognition of Coach Wieber as conference and/or national coach of the year honors. "I am so grateful to Hunter Yurachek and the University of Arkansas for the opportunity to continue to lead this program," Head Gymnastics Coach Jordyn Wieber said. "I have so much pride in being a Razorback and working with my staff to lead our student-athletes. I am so proud of what we have accomplished so far, but I am equally excited for the future. We are focused and eager to continue building this program and achieving excellence for many years to come."

# JORDYN WIEBER

FIFTH-YEAR HEAD COACH

Olympic gold medalist Jordyn Wieber was introduced as the head coach of the Arkansas Women's Gymnastics program on Wednesday, April 24, 2019, by Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Hunter Yurachek.

During her fourth season in 2023, Wieber guided the Gymbacks to their 19th consecutive regional appearance. The team set a new regional team score record of 197.275, and a new regional floor record of 49.500. The team finished the year ranked 17th in the country, maintaining the program's 18-year streak in the top 20.

Graduate transfer Norah Flatley and freshman Lauren Williams both earned berths to the NCAA Championships as individuals, extending Wieber's unblemished national appearance streak in each eligible year. Flatley earned her fourth All-American honor at the event on balance beam with a score of 9.9375, which is the best-ever score by a Gymback as an individual beam qualifier.

Arkansas' 196.825 at SEC Championships in 2023 is a new program best, and the Hogs also earned SEC highs on vault (49.425) and bars (49.175). Five Gymbacks earned All-SEC or All-SEC Freshman honors at the meet: Norah Flatley (VT, FX, AA), Lauren Williams (VT, FX), Reese Drotar (UB), Frankie Price (VT) and Cami Weaver (VT), which is the most since 2018 and second-most ever for Arkansas.

The Gymbacks also broke several records and hit new milestones in the regular season, with a new program score record of 197.475 against LSU on Jan. 27, a new program vault record of 49.525 against Kentucky on Feb. 17, and a new program beam record of 49.525 against Missouri on Feb. 24. Arkansas posted five scores above 197 for the second time in program history in the 2023 slate, the first in 2021, also under Wieber.

The Gymbacks continued to grow their fanbase with new single meet (11,031), home single season (36,619), and average attendance (7,324) records in 2023, the latter two ranking sixth and seventh in the country. Arkansas also sold out Barnhill Arena for the first time in program history on Jan. 27, when 7,147 fans were in the building to watch the Hogs take down the LSU Tigers.

Wieber has coached three regular-season All-Americans in Sophia Carter (2020), Maggie O'Hara (2021) and Kennedy Hambrick (2020, 2021). Hambrick became the new all-around score record holder (39.750) during the 2021 season, a record that had gone unbroken for seven years prior. Under her guidance in and out of the gym, the Gymbacks were awarded the Arkansas Athletics Lee Spencer Cup for the first time ever in 2022, which is awarded to the team that earns the most points in the areas of personal and career development, community engagement, and academic and athletic excellence. Arkansas also saw its first SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 10 years in 2022 with Bailey Lovett.

The Gymbacks earned their first-ever spot in the SEC night session in 2021 and advanced to the NCAA regional final after scoring a post-season program best 197.250 on day one. In total, Arkansas registered five scores of 197.000 or better in 2021 for the first time in program history. In 2020, the Gymbacks ranked as high as fourth in the nation on floor and finished the season ninth in the nation. It was against No. 13 Kentucky on Jan. 24 that Arkansas scored a 49.525 on the floor, the second-highest event total in program history. Headed into 2022, Arkansas is holding onto the third-longest active streak for meets with a score of 49.000 or higher, coming in with 32 straight meets, behind Alabama (33) and Florida (35). In Wieber's first year, Arkansas scored a 49.00 or higher in 14 of 16 events over the course of four home meets, nearly 90 percent of all events.

The Razorbacks' success on the floor helped them lock in back-to-back SEC wins against No. 20 Missouri and No. 10 Georgia mid-way through the season. The consecutive wins marked the first time since 2017 that Arkansas won two-straight conference meets and consecutive meets against a ranked opponent.

Arkansas saw six Gymbacks wrap up the 2020 season ranked in the top 100 by Road to Nationals in at least one event, with four Hogs finishing with multiple top 100 rankings. With Wieber's lead, Arkansas won 27 event titles through 10 meets. Hambrick finished the season with the most individual titles among the Gymbacks, securing 11 event titles including a team-high four all-around titles.

The first home meet of the Wieber era was held on Jan. 17 against No. 3 Denver, bringing a then-record crowd of 6,714 fans to Barnhill Arena. On Feb. 21, Coach Wieber and her Arkansas squad hosted Auburn for a Women's Empowerment Meet, the first of its kind in NCAA gymnastics and now an annual tradition for the Gymbacks.

Prior to her arrival in Fayetteville, Wieber served as an assistant for legendary UCLA coach Valorie Kondos Field. Wieber wrapped up her third season as a volunteer assistant coach at UCLA and her sixth with the program in 2019, assisting the team in a variety of roles during her first three years in Westwood following her Olympic career.

Wieber coached the Bruins on floor exercise, an event in which UCLA finished the 2018 and 2019 regular seasons ranked No. 1 in the nation. In 2019, the Bruins recorded scores of 49.5 or better in 11 of 14 meets, averaging a national-best 49.604 on floor. UCLA hit a season-high 49.825 on March 16, which ranks No. 3 all-time in school history, behind five scores of 9.925 or better in that meet, including two perfect 10s. The floor squad also posted marks of 49.775 (March 23) and 49.750 (Feb. 16) over the course of the year, as four Bruins earned regular season All-America honors in the event - Katelyn Ohashi, Kyla Ross, Gracie Kramer and Felicia Hano.

At the NCAA Championships on April 19-20, Wieber coached Ross to the individual floor title with a score of 9.950, the program's second in as many years after Ohashi took home the crown in 2018. After winning their semifinal session with a 197.650 (49.6125 in the floor), UCLA finished third overall in the finals.

The 2018 Bruins scored 49.4 or higher in 11 meets and 49.6 or higher in three meets, including a national season-high of 49.775 set Feb. 25. She and her fellow UCLA coaches were named the 2018 West Region Assistant Coaches of the Year, as they helped lead the Bruins to Pac-12, NCAA regional and NCAA national titles.

Wieber, who has been a vocal advocate for safe sport, has won several awards in the past several years, including the Arthur Ashe Courage Award at the ESPYs, the Rising Star Award by the Los Angeles Business Journal, and the Giant Steps A Hero Among Us Award.

A member of the "Fierce Five" United States squad that won team gold at the 2012 Olympics, Wieber was a two-time U.S. all-around champion (2011 and 2012) and the 2011 World all-around champion. Her illustrious elite career included three medals (all-around and team gold, beam bronze) at the 2011 World Championships, four U.S. senior national titles (all-around, bars and floor in 2011 and all-around in 2012), and three American Cup all-around titles. Wieber officially retired from competitive gymnastics in 2015.

Wieber, from DeWitt, Mich., graduated from UCLA in 2017 with a degree in Psychology. She was a 2016 inductee into the Greater Lansing Sports Hall of Fame, a 2021 Michigan Sports Hall of Fame inductee and is also a member of the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame.
