Farm Crops Rules.

1. Eligibility.

- A. **All exhibitors.** Limited to residents of Minnesota. All exhibits must have been produced within the state of Minnesota by the exhibitor. Any irregularities in adhering to this ruling will disbar all entries made by the exhibitor.
- B. **Corn exhibitors.** Exhibitors will enter and show only in the zone in which they reside. Amateur and Professional designations will apply. Seed Ear exhibitors may show on a statewide basis and in any maturity zone; with all hybrid seed growers competing together.
- C. **Seed Ear, Old Corn and New Corn exhibitors.** Open only to bona fide hybrid seed corn producers in Minnesota.
 - 1. Producers of certified hybrid seed corn.
 - 2. Hybrid Seed Corn companies.
 - 3. Bona fide contract growers for hybrid seed corn companies who have provided an affidavit from the company being produced for, implying permission by said company to exhibit the contract grown seed ears. Such affidavit shall be presented with the entry form and addressed to: Competition Department, Minnesota State Fair, 1265 Snelling Ave. N., St. Paul, MN 55108.

2. Entry dates.

- A. **All crop divisions except New Corn.** Entries close Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024, at 4:30 p.m.
 - 1. **Online registration.**
 - a. Refer to the "Farm Crops Entry Instructions" document on the website for detailed information and entry procedures.
 - b. Entry identification tags will be completed electronically and attached when your samples are delivered.
 - c. A confirmation email will be sent to your email address.
 - d. You must include the variety name in the "Variety Name and/or Number" field for each entry.
 - 2. **Mail-in registration.**
 - a. Print and complete the "Farm Crops Entry Form" on the website.
 - b. Mail to: Competition Department – c/o Farm Crops, Minnesota State Fair, 1265 Snelling Ave N, St. Paul, MN 55108.
 - c. Entry identification tags will be completed electronically and attached when your samples are delivered.
 - d. Please fill out completely and include the variety name and crop for each class entered.
- B. **New Corn.** Entries close Thursday, Aug. 29, 2024, at 8 a.m.
 - 1. **Online registration.** See information in Rule 2.A.1. above. (Only through Aug. 7 at 4:30 p.m.)
 - 2. **Mail-in registration.** See information in Rule 2.A.2. above.
- C. **Utility Certified Seed.** Samples, entry forms and analysis sheets for Utility Certified Seed should be sent by July 15 to Roger Wippler, Superintendent: Farm Crops, c/o M.C.I.A., 1900 Hendon Ave., St. Paul, MN 55108.

3. Entries.

- A. **All crop exhibitors (except corn).** Only one entry of any one variety and a maximum of five varieties will be permitted in a class by an exhibitor. No more than one sample of any one variety in each class.
- B. **Corn exhibitors.** Corn exhibitors may enter and show up to the number varieties in each of the maturity zones (five in Southern, six in Central and four in Northern). There being three maturity zones, an exhibitor may show a total of 15 different varieties. Only ten ear exhibits will be shown. No more than one sample of any one variety in each class.
 - 1. All corn varieties must be properly entered and shown in the zone designations as registered with the State of Minnesota.

2. The maturity rating of any hybrid shall be that maturity used in the official registration to permit the sale of said hybrid with the State of Minnesota, as required by existing laws. Each exhibit must be entered and shown in the proper zone to be eligible for an award.
3. Corn exhibitor is responsible for entering the hybrid in the proper maturity class but if errors are made the Superintendent and Assistants will change the entry to the proper maturity class, still allowing only five total entries per class.
4. **Divisions 107-111.** Each commercial exhibit must be properly entered and exhibited in the correct zone and the correct maturity date.
5. The exhibitor must name the hybrid and maturity rating on the entry form at the time of entry. Failure to label variety and maturity will disqualify the entry.
- C. **Utility Certified Seed exhibitors.** Maximum of five varieties.
4. **Exhibits.** All crop exhibits must be labeled with variety. Failure to do so will cause disqualification of the exhibit.
 - A. **Open Class and Old Corn.** Exhibits must be delivered by Monday, Aug. 12, 2024, at noon. Exhibits not arriving in time for the start of judging will be disqualified.
 1. If the exhibitor is unable to be present before the opening of the fair to receive and place the exhibits, they should be addressed to the superintendent and all charges prepaid to the fairgrounds (Superintendent, Farm Crops, c/o Competition, Minnesota State Fair, 1265 Snelling Ave. N., St. Paul, MN 55108). Attach entry tags (if received) to all exhibits addressed to the superintendent and they will be placed in the proper class.
 2. When exhibits are sent to the fairgrounds with no entry tag attached, a letter of explanation should be mailed to the superintendent.
 - B. **New Corn.** Exhibits must be delivered prior to Thursday, Aug. 29, 2024, at 8 a.m.
 1. Mailed exhibits are to be delivered (prepaid) to: Farm Crops Division, c/o Marie LeFebvre, Minnesota State Fair, 1265 Snelling Ave. N., St. Paul, MN 55108.
 - C. All exhibits must be kept in a neat and presentable condition during the fair, but no exhibitor shall change or alter the exhibit after the time limit designated for exhibit to be in place, until after exhibit has been passed by the judge.
5. **All exhibits shall remain in place until Labor Day, at 8 p.m.** Fairgrounds closes on Labor Day, at 9 p.m.
6. **Judging.** Premiums will not be awarded to inferior samples even if there is no competition.
 - A. In the event an exhibit is shown in any one class, the judges may at their discretion, award such an exhibit any placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. In the event only one exhibit is shown, there being no other competing exhibit in consideration for a championship award, the judges will not award a championship. At least two exhibits, by two different exhibitors, must be shown and competing for a championship. This applies in all classes in this department.
 - B. No exhibitor will in any way be permitted to assist with judging, nor shall any exhibitor attempt to influence the decision of the judges. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalties as the governing board may order.
 - C. The State Fair reserves the right to submit any exhibit to a germination test. Except for forage seeds, a test of under 80% is not eligible for a premium. For forage seed tests a minimum of 65% is qualifying.
7. **Exhibit return.**
 - A. **Sheaves of Grain.**
 1. **Labor Day, between 8-9 p.m.** For those exhibitors who are already on the fairgrounds.
 2. **Wednesday, Sept. 4, 2024, between 4-6 p.m.**
 3. **Thursday, Sept. 5, 2024, between 8-11:30 a.m.**
 - B. **Crop samples.** No samples will be returned unless requested in writing to the Superintendent, at time of making entry. All Utility Certified Seed samples and any samples not requested to be saved will be disposed of at the end of the fair, under the supervision of the management.
8. **Corn exhibits.**
 - A. All seed ear exhibits shall be properly identified with the same designation as used in the sale of such hybrid. Failure to comply with this requirement will be grounds for disqualification.
 - B. In the seed ear class only, an exhibitor will be permitted to exhibit any hybrid by the maturity date of that hybrid.
 - C. Each commercial exhibit must be properly entered and exhibited in the correct zone and the correct maturity date.
 - D. The hybrid must have been registered for sale with the State of Minnesota.

- E. Old corn shall be grown the year just previous to the year for which this premium list is issued.
9. **Corn Zone Classification.**
- A. **Southern Zone.** Counties of Blue Earth, Brown, Cottonwood, Faribault, Fillmore, Freeborn, Houston, Jackson, LeSueur, Martin, Mower, Murray, Nicollet, Nobles, Redwood, Rice, Rock, Sibley, Steele, Waseca, Watonwan, Winona.
- B. **Central Zone.** Counties of Anoka, Big Stone, Benton, Carver, Chippewa, Chisago, Dakota, Dodge, Douglas, Goodhue, Grant, Hennepin, Isanti, Kandiyohi, Lac Qui Parle, Lincoln, Lyon, McLeod, Meeker, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Olmsted, Ottertail, Pipestone, Pope, Ramsey, Renville, Scott, Sherburne, Stearns, Swift, Todd, Traverse, Wabasha, Washington, Wilkins, Wright, Yellow Medicine.
- C. **Northern Zone.** Counties of Aitkin, Becker, Beltrami, Carlton, Cass, Clay, Clearwater, Cook, Crow Wing, Itasca, Hubbard, Kanabec, Kittson, Koochiching, Lake of the Woods, Mahnomon, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Pine, Polk, Red Lake, Roseau, St. Louis, Wadena.
10. **Definitions.**
- A. **Seed Ears - Hybrid Corn.** Ears from hybrid crossing plots, which may be single cross, three-way cross, or double cross. This seed produces the commercial hybrid seed corn.
- B. **Commercial Ears - Hybrid Corn.** Crop grown from the seed produced in hybrid corn crossing plots, and which is intended for feed.
1. **Single crosses.** Crop grown from the seed produced in hybrid crossing plots involving two inbred lines.
2. **Double crosses.** Crop grown from the seed produced in hybrid crossing plots involving two single crosses.
3. **Three-way crosses.** Crop grown from the seed produced in hybrid crossing plots involving an inbred line and a single cross.
- C. **Exhibitors.** Exhibitors shall be classified according to the following definitions. An exhibitor will be permitted to exhibit in any one division, either as an amateur exhibitor or as a professional exhibitor.
1. **Amateur.** Open to any resident of Minnesota who has not been designated a professional exhibitor by the Minnesota State Fair management.
- a. Exhibitors showing in the amateur division may not show in the professional divisions.
- b. An exhibitor who has won a total of five or more first place premiums in the amateur or professional divisions in the last three years, or who has won a champion showman award in the last three years, will be permanently designated a professional division exhibitor. This shall apply to all members of a household, partnership, business, or corporation.
2. **Professional.** Open to any resident of Minnesota who has won five or more first place premiums in amateur or professional division competition during the last three years.
- a. A professional exhibitor may not exhibit in the amateur divisions. This shall apply to all members of a household, partnership, business, or corporation.
- b. Upon becoming a professional exhibitor, the exhibitor shall remain in this division unless otherwise informed by the Minnesota State Fair management. These classifications shall apply only to the commercial ears divisions. In the seed ears division, any exhibitor may show provided all requirements as to eligibility as set forth in division 108, seed ears, are met.
11. **Exhibit labeling.** All entries must be labeled with variety. Failure to label variety will disqualify the entry.
- A. **Corn exhibits.** All corn varieties must be properly entered and shown in the zone designations as registered with the State of Minnesota. The exhibitor must name the hybrid and maturity rating on the entry form at the time of making entry. Failure to label variety and maturity will disqualify the entry.
12. The management of the Minnesota State Fair reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto.

Division 103: Sheaves of Grain

Sheaves of Grain Rules

1. In addition to the division rules, exhibitors and exhibits are bound by the overall farm crops department rules.
2. One entry per class per exhibitor.
3. Limited to first 20 entries in each class.
4. Sheaves shall be cured and must measure four inches in diameter at the base.
5. **Variety must be labeled.** Failure to label variety will disqualify the entry.
6. Judging will be based on quality of crop and appearance.
 - A. **Preparation of sheaf to include dressing up.**
 1. Colored ribbon may not exceed one inch in width.
 2. Ribbon used in three locations on the sheaf.

1. In addition to the division rules, exhibitors and exhibits are bound by the overall farm crops department rules.
2. Exhibits of small grains, flax, soybeans, shelled corn, and forage crop seeds may be from the 2022 or 2023 crop.
 - A. Exhibits must consist of two quarts.
 - B. Exhibits must be labeled with variety name. Failure to label variety will disqualify the exhibit.
3. **Varieties.** Any variety published in the 2023 edition of Minnesota Field Crop Trials, Minnesota Agricultural Experiment Station, University of Minnesota. Available at varietytrials.umn.edu.
 - A. A partial list of eligible varieties is available by contacting the Competition Department.

Division 105: Utility Certified Seed

Utility Certified Seed Rules

1. Open to members of the Minnesota Crop Improvement Association who produce certified seed. Only certified and registered seed of certifiable varieties are eligible.
2. One class per variety of each individual contract grower will be eligible for entry in the certified seed show class. The entry will be made in a joint manner, for example: Byron Farm Seed and Walter Byron, Waseca. The approved plant name would be shown first followed by the contract grower's name, and the address of the approved plant. Awards payments will be made to the contractor.
 - A. Either 2022 or 2023 crop may be shown except as indicated.
3. Exhibits of small grains, flax, soybeans, shelled corn, sunflowers, field peas and forage crop seeds must represent the following minimum size of seed class in order to be eligible for competition:
 - A. Small grains - 100 bushels
 - B. Flax - 5 bushels
 - C. Soybeans - 50 bushels
 - D. Sunflowers, field peas - 500 pounds
 - E. Grade or hybrid shelled corn - 25 bushels
 - F. Forage legume or grass - 50 pounds
4. Exhibits to consist of four quarts of small grains, soybeans, sunflowers, field peas, hybrid shelled corn, forage, turf and flax seed.
5. Exhibits of small grains, flax, soybeans, shelled corn, sunflowers, field peas and forage crop seeds must be field and laboratory inspected and passed and will be judged on the basis of M.C.I.A. approved seed laboratory tests.
 - A. Exhibits must be from the 2023 crop only, except as noted.
6. Samples, entry forms and analysis sheets for Utility Certified Seed can be sent by July 15 to Roger Wippler, Superintendent: Farm Crops, c/o M.C.I.A., 1900 Hendon Ave., St. Paul, MN 55108.
7. Exhibits must arrive by Monday, Aug. 12, 2024, at noon. Exhibits not arriving in time for the commencement of judging will be disqualified. May be delivered to the Superintendent Farm Crops, Minnesota State Fair, 1265 Snelling Ave. N., St. Paul, MN, 55108.
8. Certifiable varieties: See Minnesota Crop Improvement Association 2024 Directory.
 - A. Exhibits to consist of one-half peck (four quarts) of small grains, soybeans, sunflowers, field peas, and hybrid shelled corn; four quarts of forage, turf, and flax seed.
9. **Approved Seed Cleaning Plant Contest**
 - A. Entries close Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024, at 4:30 p.m.
 - B. Exhibits must be delivered by Monday, Aug. 12, 2024, at noon.
10. The Minnesota Crop Improvement Association will sponsor half of the premiums.
11. **Approved Seed Cleaning Plant Contest.** Entries in the Utility Certified Seed Class will be considered for this contest, and the sample submitted will be entered in the name of the grower in the regular competition. The records available at the M.C.I.A. will determine where each entry was cleaned.
 - A. One sample of any one variety, from any one grower, may be submitted by the approved plant.
 - B. **Point system.** 1st place, 25 points; 2nd place, 20 points; 3rd place, 15 points; 4th place, 10 points; 5th place, 5 points; all other placings, 1 point.
 1. In the event of a tie, the plant with the greatest number of first placings, or champions will be awarded an additional 5 points.
 - C. **Awards.** Three district awards; Northwest, Southwest, and Southeast. The approved seed cleaning plants have been notified of their district assignments.
