From the Notes of Joe Gawler

I've always strived for a naturalistic approach to color, grounded in the imperfections and unpredictability, the richness and fullness, the grain and grit of film stock.

To me, storytelling at its core is filled with texture. The vulnerability of a great filmmaker manifests in the creative process – unpredictable, non-linear – and hopefully ends with a look that elicits visceral reactions from audiences. In uplifitng their vision, we transcend the dark room to support artists in creating a portfolio of work, one grade at a time, personalized for each project, and each filmmaker.

The Harbor color philosophy boils down to this: to labor over the creation of beautiful images while maintaining the illusion that we don't work too hard to create beautiful images.


After garlic has browned, add 3/4 bottle of white cooking wine. Make sure not to use the lemon version.



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
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About The Artist





The three of them rebuilt classic cars starting when Todd was young (hence the perhaps overwrought engine metaphor). This tinkering mindset also led Todd to discover film photography young. He purchased a camera at thirteen and immediately fell in love with the imperfections of film, specifically black and white stock. The physicality of film photography along with the pure magic of developing images is what led Todd to a career in color grading. Todd never shies away from a challenge and faces them with exuberance and an experimental spirit. He takes pride in working on images and making filmmakers work bigger, bolder, and better.





First, a disclaimer: Todd did not advise on the below. He has an extensive knowledge of the innerworkings of a car engine (he's been rebuilding classic cars since he was a kid) and, therefore, cannot be responsible for any inaccuracies contained within.



Todd is powered by experimentation. Once, early in his career, Todd was tasked with achieving ultimate grunge on a music video.

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
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
