
All you need to know about CoR's activities and events!

With 8.418 registered participants and 450 speakers and 98 moderators the EURegionsWeek was rightfully the event of the month!

The participants had the opportunity to attend 244 sessions, including 210 workshops, participatory labs and political sessions as well as 34 Regional Talks.





Maxime Van Boven (NL/PES), Florian Wunsch (AT/Greens), and Michelle Glanzner (DE/EPP) intervened as speakers during the Opening Session. Helene Pollozec (FR/Renew) and Svitlana Yarova (UA/PES) took the floor during the 157th Plenary while many more spoke throughout different sessions. Throughout the Week, the engagement of the YEP network left a remarkable and enlightening impact.

93 YEPs from in total 24 countries, including 4 candidate countries, actively participated in workshops and events with many assuming pivotal roles as speakers and facilitators.

36 YEPs attended the first high-level political debate organised for the YEP and EU Councillors networks, with President Cordeiro and Vice-President Šuica as keynote speakers.

Throughout the week, over 15 YEPs were filmed for **social media reels** highlighting EURegionsWeek, resulting in over **1430 views on Instagram**. The initiatives aimed to showcase the YEP Programme and promote the EU elections.

Interview with Ricardo Rio

Learn more about social economy!

In this month's newsletter, **Ricardo Rio** (PT/EPP), mayor of Braga and rapporteur for the CoR opinion on

<u>Creating an enabling environment for the social economy</u>, points out the significance of the social economy within regions and cities, its relation to the green transition, and the potential challenges faced along with strategies to bolster collaboration.

What is social economy? Why does it matter to regions and cities?

Social economy refers to a broad category of economic activities and organisations that prioritise social objectives over profit maximization. Social economy organisations play a crucial role in fostering community development while often focusing on marginalised or vulnerable groups. By prioritising local development and sustainability, they can contribute to the resilience of regions and cities.

In the context of the green transition, how can cooperation between cities/regions and the social economy sector be enhanced?

In the context of the green transition, cooperation between cities/regions and the social economy sector is vital. To enhance this cooperation, we need to establish strong partnerships and networks that bring together local governments, social economy organisations, and relevant stakeholders. In my CoR Opinion, I stressed that Local governments should use their purchasing power to support social economy enterprises engaged in green activities.

What are the main challenges hindering the social economy from reaching its full potential?

Social economy sector faces several challenges that hinder it from reaching its full potential. There is still limited access to capital while a significant challenge is the lack of awareness of what social economy organisations do. In some sectors, social economy organisations face strong competition from for-profit businesses.

Evelyn Regner, Vice-President of the European Parliament and Helena Dalli, European Commissioner for Equality, underlined the significance of achieving balanced representation for both women and men in the realm of politics.
