Insider's look Winter School on participatory democracy in Brussels



We are pleased to announce the successful conclusion of the **three-day Winter School** in Brussels, where more than 20 YEPs gathered from 14 to 16 February to deepen their knowledge on participatory democracy as part of their active participation in four online trainings of the "Becoming a Citizen Participation Expert: A Capacity Building Programme", launched by the European Committee of the Regions (CoR) and the Bertelsmann Stiftung as part of the A new chapter for EU democracy initiative.



Our YEPs engaged in interactive sessions and workshops by the Bertelsmann Stiftung and IKU, acquiring tools to strengthen community ties and develop their own projects on citizens' engagement.

A key moment was the exchange with Vasco Alves Cordeiro, President of the CoR, discussing our collective future and the significance of honesty and engagement in building trust.

Another highlight was introducing the together.eu platform by the European Parliament, aimed at motivating voting on the road towards the EU elections in June 2024.

Highlights from the 159th Plenary session

Debate on the EU elections

Together with representatives of youth organisations and CoR members, five YEPs, Kateryna Musiienko (EPP/UA), Sophie Hütteman (PES/DE), Agata Puchalska (ECR/PL), Máirín McGrath (EA/IE) and Kathrin Werth (Greens/IT) took the floor during the debate on 1 February and discussed how to engage young Europeans on the ground.

The debate emphasized the need to engage young Europeans in politics, addressing their concerns such as housing and employment, and encouraging them to vote in the 2024 European elections. Despite growing political activism among youth, they feel underrepresented and concerned about issues like affordability and the environment. Suggestions to increase youth participation include lowering voting and candidacy ages, introducing youth quotas, and improving civic education. The debate highlighted the role of local regions in connecting EU policies to young citizens' needs and discussed initiatives like the YEP Programme to involve youth in EU decision-making. The upcoming elections, with lowered voting ages in some countries - Belgium, Germany, Malta and Austria will allow their citizens to vote from the age of 16, and in Greece the voting age is 17 -, present an opportunity to further involve young people in shaping the EU's future.

Debate on lessons learned from COP28

The YEP and Mayor of Vöcklabruck, Peter Schobesberger (PES/AT), intervened during the "Debate on lessons learned from COP28: the critical role of local and regional leaders for global climate action" at the 159th plenary session on 31 January, where he presented the Vöckla-Ager hydrogen project, which aims to make the district heating supply completely free of natural gas and its associated emissions. "Vöcklabruck is the region where renewable hydrogen can celebrate its birth," he underlined
