Infinite Campus Portal

The Infinite Campus Portal is the means by which parents and students can access student and household information online. An account is required to access this confidential information. If you do not have an account or cannot remember your account username or account password you can go to this link <http://forms.dcgschools.com/dcgschools/campus-portal-account-request> to request a new or reset username or password. The Campus Portal Account is used for many different types of information and access.

1. Pay Fees Online
2. Deposit money in a student's meal account
3. Online registration which is done each year and helps the district maintain accurate information including health and up-to-date contacts for your student.
4. Access to (depending on grade level) student schedule, course grades and comments, grade level standards progress, attendance, report cards for the active year, assessment scores, course assignments, missing assignments report, food service information including account balance and what meal and additional food items are being purchased by your student, a record of student fees for the active year, and household information such as home address, household members and home phone number.

There are separate accounts for students and parents. A parent will see information for all students enrolled in a Dallas Center-Grimes District school. A student account will only display information for that specific student. Students are set up with a Campus Portal account beginning in 6th grade. Student accounts cannot be used for Online Registration.

Should you forget your account password, there are links on the Campus Portal Login screen which can be found at https://infinitecampus.dcg-grimes.k12.ia.us/campus/portal/dallas_center.jsp Select the link if you have forgotten your password or separate link for forgotten username. You will need to have an email address entered in the Account Settings area of the Campus portal. You will be sent a password reset link.

RevTrak

- The Campus Portal Account username is also used to access/create the account for RevTrak. RevTrak online payment can be found here: <https://dcgschools.revtrak.net/>
- If this is your first time using RevTrak, use the Click Here link under Lunch & Fee Payments. This will ask for your Campus Portal account username and the date of birth of one of your students in the format of MM/DD/YYYY

If you are sure of your check-out information, enter that email address and password in the Quick Checkout box.

Immunization Requirements

A completed card needs to be on file on or before the first day of school in order for your child to attend school.

Thank you for your assistance and attention to this state requirement. If you have questions or concerns, you may call a school nurse (contact information for each school is located on page 2).

The following is a list of required immunizations for 2017-18:

1. HIB: 3 doses with final dose in the series received on or after 12 months of age, or one dose receive when the applicant is 15 months or older.
2. POLIO: atleast four doses of polio vaccine with one dose being received after the child's fourth birthday.
3. DTP/DTaP: atleast five doses of diphtheria, tetanus, pertusis with one dose being received after the child's fourth birthday.
4. Tdap: one dose if enrolling in seventh grade
5. HEPATITIS B: three doses of hepatitis B vaccine prior to enrollment.
6. VARICELLA: two doses received on or after 12 months of age if born on or after September 15, 2003 OR have a history of natural disease as stated by parent or guardian is required.

Illness

If your child is absent due to illness, please send a note to school when he/she returns to school describing the illness, so that we may clearly identify the health problems of our school. If you are uncertain as to the length of time to keep your child at home, please contact the school.

Rules Concerning Administration of Medication at School

These rules and procedures are for dispensing medication to those pupils who must take prescribed medication and/or over the counter drugs during school. NO MEDICATION SHALL BE DISPENSED TO ANY PUPIL OF DALLAS CENTER-GRIMES COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT UNLESS THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET:

A licensed medical or osteopathic physician or dentist must prescribe the medication. The form, "Request for Administering Prescription Medicine or Over the Counter Drugs or Medicines at School" must be completed and filed at school.

The medicine shall be maintained in the original prescription container which shall be labeled with:

- Name of student
- Name of physician or dentist prescribing medication
- Name of medication
- Name and address of pharmacy
- Directions for use, dosage, time and route

The medication, while at school, shall be kept in a designated place, in a locked cabinet. When required, refrigeration will be provided.

Access to the medication shall be under the authority of the building principal or a designated person. A written record will be kept on any medication(s) given at school. This record will include the student's name, the name of the medication, the amount of medication to be given, and the time at which it is given. After the medication is given, the person dispensing the medication will initial the medication sheet with his/her initials. This record shall be kept at each time the medication is given at school, on the appropriate, "Medication Record" form. At vacation time, end of school year, or end of dispensing time,

SCHOOL BUS INFORMATION

The District provides transportation to students that qualify. School bus stops are determined by grade and by distances students live from their school. Students who live more than two miles from their school qualify for school bus transportation. For this purpose, two miles is measured by the most direct public road. Exceptions are made when there are no walking paths connecting the student's neighborhood to their school. The most updated bus routes can be found on the website.

Parents are encouraged to utilize school bus service for their children. School bus transportation is safer, less expensive, and reduces the traffic congestion at the schools. School transportation coordinating instructions are below:

1. School bus routes are posted on the school web page at: www.dcgschools.com under the SCHOOL BUS INFO tab. Double check for updates to the route schedules a week before school starts in case there are any changes.
2. Students requiring special transportation or home pickup will be individually called by the school bus driver by Saturday, August 19.
3. Each bus has a black & white route number sign on the right side of the bus school bus. There are multiple buses using each bus stop so make sure your child is using the correct bus to their school.
4. We have found that children become more comfortable with the bus and bus rules if they ride both ways for the first few days.
5. We would like parents' assistance in giving the transported kindergarten students the best start possible for their bus ride experience. To assure a smooth beginning, please review the following suggestions:

-Escort your child to the bus STOP the first day of school and follow in a car to meet your child as they get off the bus and walk them into the building.

-The district does not require parents of kindergarten students to meet the bus on a daily basis throughout the year, but we certainly encourage it.

Bus Video Cameras

The school board has authorized the use of video cameras on Dallas Center-Grimes School District school buses. The video cameras will be used to monitor student behavior in order to promote and maintain a safe environment. Bus camera video may be used in student disciplinary proceedings. Video will be retained only if necessary for use in student disciplinary proceedings or other matters as determined by the administration. Parents may request to view video of their child if the video is used in a disciplinary proceeding involving their child.



Parents, please take a few minutes to review these safety rules with your children before the first day of school. School bus service is a privilege offered to eligible students. School bus service may be suspended if a student fails to follow bus rules or endangers the safety of others on the bus.

1. Follow instructions of the bus driver.
2. While waiting for the school bus, stand in an orderly fashion.
3. NEVER approach a school bus until it stops and the driver signals you that it is safe to board.
4. If you need to cross the street in front of a school bus, ALWAYS wait for the "thumbs up" from the driver before you cross.
5. NEVER walk behind or along the side of the school bus.
6. When exiting a school bus, ALWAYS take 10 steps away from the bus.
7. After entering the bus, go directly to a seat and sit down.
8. Books and other property must be properly stowed out of the aisle.
9. Talk quietly with those around you using inside voices; Never use loud or vulgar language.
10. ALWAYS remain seated and face forward on the bus while the bus is in motion.
11. NEVER put your hands, arms, or head out the window.
12. NEVER throw things inside or outside the bus.
13. ALWAYS be courteous to the driver and to fellow students.
14. Food and drink are not allowed on the bus unless specifically permitted by the bus driver.
15. No perfume, cologne, hairspray, deodorant, fingernail, or aerosol sprays are permitted to be used on the bus.
16. If you drop something near the bus, tell the bus driver or wait for the bus to pass. NEVER try to pick it up because the driver may not be able to see you. Never crawl under a bus.
17. Report problems or concerns to the driver or teacher immediately. Never be afraid to talk to a bus driver.

School buses across the country transport millions of students every year and are the safest way for kids to get to school. DC-G transports around 1,500 students per day and our number one priority is "SAFETY". Transporting kids to and from school takes a team effort to be successful. Parents, students, and the school all need to work together to provide the safest transportation possible.

Parents Responsibilities:

1. Ensure your child arrives at their bus STOP safely and on time.
2. During extreme weather, ensure your child boards the bus safely because times may vary.
3. Review the Bus Rules with your child.

Bus Driver and School Responsibilities:

1. Ensure the school bus is safe to transport students.
2. Ensure buses run on time.
3. Ensure there are enough seats on each bus to transport students safely.
4. Ensure all students are safely transported to and from school.

Student's Responsibilities:

1. Arrive at the bus STOP on time.
2. Follow ALL of the bus safety rules.

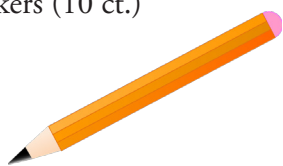

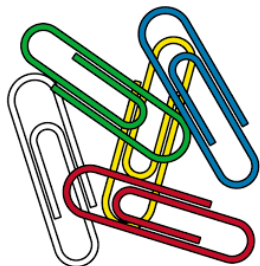

Driving and Parking

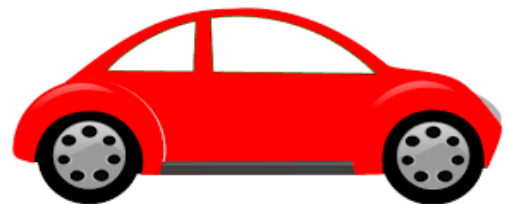
All students are to register their vehicles in the office. A \$5 charge for a parking hangtag is required yearly. All vehicles that are driven to the school must be registered. The hangtag is to be hung, from the rear-view mirror of the vehicle, and easily observable. If a different vehicle is driven, simply transfer the hangtag to the car driven that particular day. All cars must be parked correctly, with no double parking or “pulling through” parking spots, facing the wrong way.

At this time, parking in the front and back lot is open to all vehicle registered high school students, with a few exceptions. Students are not allowed to park in the entire first row (closest row in front of Meadows and the high school). These spots are reserved for staff members and visitors. Students should also not park in additional designated staff areas. We are in the process of having assigned parking spaces in the near future and will have information out as soon as we have finalized those plans. Students will not be eligible for an assigned parking space unless they have registered their vehicle in the high school office. Please visit the handbook for additional information regarding the policies for driving and parking at the high school.

Driver’s Education

We will continue to offer four sessions of driver’s education each year, if we have enough interest. Please call the Meadows school office at 986-0105 to sign up your child for any of these programs. The cost at present time is \$325 for each session. Students must be at least 14 years old and have a permit to sign up, as well as a signed parent permission slip. Eighth through 12 graders may sign up for each session. Usually the fall and spring session are the busiest. Below you will find information about each session. Fee’s for out of district students are \$375. A complete list of sessions can be found on the school website.

The fall program will begin in mid-October and end before winter break in December. There will be a meeting in early October to hand out information and collect payment if necessary. Please pay ahead if possible. Classroom days are Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 6:45 to 8:00 am. Most students will drive during study hall times. If this can’t be worked out, before or after school driving may be arranged. All students who drive during study halls will drive at least once on Saturday for 2 hours downtown Des Moines. Shuttle bus service from Dallas Center will also be available in the morning to bring students in early for classroom. Class size is limited to 40 students. Home school students are welcome. Classrooms will be held in Meadows media center.
