DC-G Families,

Our District has utilized a Facility Planning Committee for 20 years to plan our District needs, enrollment projections, projects, and facility needs. This committee met five times throughout the 2017-2018 school year. In June 2018, the committee increased participation and membership to assist with planning a proposed 7th-8th grade building.

Under the direction of the District's architects, Frevert Ramsey Kobes, this committee reviewed updated design concepts including flexible learning spaces, a 5-12 Future Ready student vision, and DC-G's commitment to excellence in education. Such a facility, if approved by the public, would open in 2021-2022 and impact the students currently in all elementary grades throughout the District. The new facility would alleviate overcrowding in buildings to provide adequate learning space for our elementaries, middle schools, and high school.

The parents, patrons, and educators who have served on this committee have spent a great deal of effort working toward providing the best future for DC-G students. Many of them will be taking time to visit with patrons about a future facility and the needs of our District. Committee members will host various learning opportunities for the community to learn more about the needs and opportunities throughout DC-G schools.
