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WINTER SCHOOL BUS SAFETY TIPS

As we move into the winter months, it is a good idea to review school bus stop safety tips with your children. Please take a few minutes to review these tips with your child.

DO's

- Do dress in warm winter clothing: hats, gloves, and boots.
- Do be on time at the bus stop.
- Do wait for the bus several feet further off the road in a safe place. Be mindful that some stops may still have snow piles or drifts.
- Do go home and call your school if you think you missed your bus and we will come back to get you.
- Do move away from the bus to a place where the driver can see you and you can see the driver after you get off the bus.
- Do cross 10 feet in front of the bus and wait for the "thumps up" signal from the driver before leaving the curb.

DON'Ts

- Don't stand or play on snow piles at the bus stop - you could slide into the street in the path of oncoming traffic.
- Don't walk along side a school bus.
- Don't attempt to retrieve your books or lunchbox from around or underneath the bus until after it has cleared the unloading zone.
- Don't push or shove when getting on or off the bus.
- Don't chase after the bus or touch a school bus that is passing by.
- Important Note: Parents are responsible for children's safety before and after they board the school bus. This is especially important during extreme weather.

HIGH SCHOOL

Student Recognition Assembly. This fall the high school held a school-wide assembly to celebrate the student's accomplishments throughout the past year. Below are some highlights:

- 352 students increased their GPA from the beginning of last school year to the end of the year.
- 428 college classes were taken last year, earning over 2,000 college credits.
- 192 students took 297 Advanced Placement exams last year.
- 23.4 was the average ACT score for DC-G students. The state average is 21.8.
- We recognized eight seniors that represent DC-G at the National Council on Youth Leadership. Three seniors were also recognized as National Merit Scholars. These three students are in the top 2% of the country.
- We recognized students that attended school at a very high level, including students who did not have a single tardy last year.
- We highlighted our students of the month, choir students, band students, speech students, students involved in clubs and sports, students that are employed or volunteer outside of school, students that have chosen their post-secondary path, students that attended a school conference, workshop, summit and/or career exploration this fall!

It was a fantastic morning together celebrating our school and community. Our students get all the credit, but it would not be possible without the support of amazing teachers and parents!

Cross country continues to be on the rise at DC-G! The Mustangs celebrated their awesome season at a banquet on November 5. Despite the departure of six of the top seven and nine of the top 14 runners from last year, the Mustangs finished seventh at State this year, only 18 points out of fifth. They are one of two teams in Class 3A to finish in the top seven each of the last five years. They also finished second in the Little Hawkeye Conference and won their fifth straight JV Little Hawkeye Conference title. There were 12 additions to the record board! This was the best finish at the state meet in school history. In route to the state meet the Fillies also won the State Qualifying Meet, and Little Hawkeye Conference Championship Meets. The JV team also won the LHC meet for the second year in a row. Megan Sterbenz, Emma Angus, and Hannah Little were recognized as All Conference and Individual State Qualifiers by finishing in the top 15 in those meets. Drivers Education for 2018-2019. We will continue to offer four sessions of driver's education each year, if we have enough interest. Please call the Meadows school office at 986-0105 to sign up your child for any of these programs. The cost at present time is \$325 for each session. Students must be at least 14 years old and have a permit to sign up, as well as a signed parent permission slip. 8th through 12 graders may sign up for each session. Usually the fall and spring session are the busiest. Below you will find information about each session. Fees for out of district students are \$375.

Winter Session 2019- The winter program will begin in early January and end before spring break in March. There will be a meeting in December to hand out information and collect payment. Classroom days are Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 6:45 to 8:00 a.m. Most students will drive during their study hall times. If this can't be worked out, before or after school times may be arranged. All students who drive during study halls will drive at least once on Saturday for 2 hours downtown Des Moines. Shuttle bus service from Dallas Center will also be available in the morning to bring students to classroom. Class size is limited to 40 students. Home school students are welcome. Classes held in the Meadows media center. If we don't have at least 12 students sign up the session will be cancelled until spring session.

Spring Session 2019- The spring program will begin after spring break and end in May. There will be a meeting before spring break to hand out information and collect payment. Classroom days are Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 6:45 to 8:00 a.m. Most students will drive during their study hall times. If this can't be worked out, before or after school driving may be arranged. All students who drive during study halls will drive at least once on Saturday for 2 hours downtown Des Moines. Shuttle bus service from Dallas Center will also be available in the morning to bring students in early for classroom work. Class size is limited to 40 students. Home school students are welcome. Classes will be held in the Meadows Media Center.

All payments and permission slips should be made or turned in before the first class. Payment plans may be arranged with the office.
