Registration for the Fall Pay-to-Ride (PTR) school bus service is now open. The purpose of this service is to assist parents in transporting their child to and from school. This service is fully funded by fees paid by parents that participate in this service. Parents interested in the PTR School Bus service are welcome to register for this service but payment will not be accepted until July 1st.

Program Details:

- 1. Available to Kindergarten through 5th grade students who live between 1-2 miles of their assigned school and live within the school boundary of their assigned school. See the PTR Eligibility Map for your school by visiting www.dcgschools.com/transportation. Distance is calculated by using public streets.
- 2. You do not need to register again if you are already participating in the PTR service. Please advise us if your child does NOT plan to utilize this service next year. The service will automatically be discontinued if your child is moving to 6th grade.
- 3. PTR Registrations are processed in the order they are received and space is limited. Once space is full, students will be placed on a waiting list.
- 4. Registration for a PTR School Bus Pass is a TWO step process. a. Complete and submit a PTR School Bus Pass Registration. b. We can not accept payment for this service until July 1st. Pay online with a credit or debit card at DC-G Schools RevTrak by the end of July.
- 5. The fee for a PTR School Bus Pass is \$275 per semester per student. Students eligible for the DC-G free/reduced school lunch program will be charged a reduced fee of \$150 per semester.

All candidates are evaluated based on their leadership and strength of character. Each applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA to be considered. Beyond meeting the academic bar, students are chosen based on their service and leadership in the school and community.





M. Grimes earned a National Status Award for her artwork, The Mouth. Initially, M. Grimes won a gold key in the first round which is awarded to the top 5-7% of all students. Her work then moved to the National Competition where she was awarded a Silver Key. This is the first time a Dallas Center-Grimes student has won at the national level. DCG PTO Box Tops for Education has made changes to the way that our schools can earn money. The traditional Box Top Clips are being phased out of production as they work to become completely digital. You can still submit the traditional box tops to the elementary schools until they are no longer found on products. Each Box Top is worth \$0.10 and if everyone is scanning their receipts, this adds up very quickly. The money earned is split between all four elementary schools. The app is easy to use! Search the app store on your phone or go to the Box Tops for Education website at BTFE.com.

Download the app and select our district by searching for "Dallas Center Elementary School".

Click on the Scan button and take as many photos as you need of your receipt to capture the entire purchase.

As you are scanning your receipt there is a star icon that allows you to give credit to a specific classroom. Type in the teacher's name and then submit. (This is optional but will be used during our collection contests.)

Online grocery shopping receipts from places like Instacart and Walmart can be submitted online by forwarding your email receipt to receipts@boxtops4education.com using the same email that is associated with your account in the app.

The PTO Box Tops Committee understands that this process does take a little bit longer than clipping physical packages but we do not want to miss this opportunity for our schools. 
MIDDLE SCHOOL
