
#### DCG SPECIAL ELECTION - APRIL 11

On Tuesday, April 11, the Dallas Center-Grimes Community School District will be holding a special election. The ballot will feature three DCG CSD topics.

#### **Topic 1 - Method of Election for School Board Directors**

In 2022, the Dallas Center-Grimes Community School Board initiated the process of passing a resolution that would shift our district's Method of Election for School Board Directors to seven at-large positions. This would be a change from our previous system, which featured four School Board Director Districts and three at-large positions. Community members filed a petition at the February 2023 DCG School Board meeting and our current School Board voted to take this issue to a public vote.

At the March 6 DCG Special School Board meeting, directors came to a consensus of using Director District Map #3 (below), if voted on by the public.

To be eligible for the Iowa Seal of Biliteracy, each student must demonstrate proficiency in English and a world language through various assessments. Students who earn the Seal of Biliteracy will be recognized during the graduation ceremony, and the seal will be shown on their diploma and official transcript. **Note from the Nurse**: Students are not allowed to have medications with them at school. All medication (prescription and over the counter) must be kept in the health office and will be administered under the supervision of the school nurse or delegated trained school employee. Administration of medication at school requires a parent/guardian signature on the district Medication Authorization Form, which can be found in Appendix C, on the district's website under forms, or in the school Health Office. Medication must be brought in the original container or labeled by the pharmacy or the manufacturer with the name of the student, name of the medication, time of day that it is to be given, dosage and duration. Medications must be age-appropriate and will be administered according to label recommendations.
