DR. SCOTT BLUM NAMED INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT

The Dallas Center-Grimes Community School District is excited to welcome Dr. Scott Blum as the Interim Superintendent for the 2023-24 school year. Dr. Blum's new role was approved by the Dallas Center-Grimes School Board on Friday, April 28.

Dr. Blum is currently serving as the Dallas Center-Grimes High School Principal, a role he's held since July of 2016. Prior to his role as high school principal, Dr. Blum was the DCG High School Dean of Students.



"My family is proud to be Dallas Center-Grimes Mustangs. It's at the core of who we are as a family," Dr. Blum says. "I am honored to serve our district as interim superintendent and look forward to the tremendous opportunity ahead of us."

"Dr. Blum's commitment to DCG is unmatched and we are so excited to work alongside him next year," says the DCG School Board. "We had an exceptional pool of candidates for this position and Dr. Blum's love and compassion for our students and staff stood out."

Dr. Blum received his Bachelor of Science from Iowa State University in 2004. He completed his Masters of Ed Admin at Iowa State in 2008. In 2020, he received his Superintendent License from Drake University and completed a Doctorate in Education Leadership from Drake in 2022.

"This is a milestone moment for me and my family," Dr. Blum says. "My passion for DCG is unwavering and I am committed to serving this district with my heart and soul."

Dr. Blum's first day as DCG Interim Superintendent will be July 1, 2023.

School Calendar Update

Special Election Results - Dallas Center-Grimes CSD held a special election on Tuesday, April 11. There were three topics on the ballot in this election (only voters in District 1were able to vote for all three).

School Board Director | At-Large - Nancy Baker Curtis was elected as an At-Large School Board Director, receiving 809 votes. Matthew Moran received 580 votes. Baker Curtis will be seated through November 2023. **School Board Director | District 1** - Nick Fiala was elected as the District 1 School Board Director, receiving 190 votes. Kendra Wolf received 175 votes. Fiala will be seated through November 2025.

Method of Election for School Board Directors - Voters decided to stay with School Board Director Districts. Voters cast 1,004 no votes (stay with four director districts and three at-large districts) and 372 yes votes (move to seven at-large director districts).
