HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR CALCULATED

This CBS News/YouGov survey is based on a nationally representative sample of 1,591 adults who were recontacted June 24-25, 2022 after the Supreme Court decision overturning *Roe v. Wade* was released, following an initial survey conducted before the decision on June 22-24, 2022 using a nationally representative sample of 2,265 U.S. adults. The recontact rate was 70%.

The sample of recontacted respondents was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based upon the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote, partisan identification, and pre-decision opinion on *Roe v. Wade* of the national sample. The weights range from 0.03 to 9.5, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.9.

The *margin of error* (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 3.3%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + CV^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
