COMMENT SOUGHT ON PETITIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION AND CLARIFICATION OF THE COMMISSION'S INTERCALL ORDER FILED BY GLOBAL CONFERENCE PARTNERS, A+ CONFERENCING LTD., FREE CONFERENCING CORPORATION, AND THE CONFERENCE GROUP

On June 30, 2008, the Commission released the *InterCall Order*, in which the Commission stated that InterCall, Inc. and all similarly situated audio bridging service providers are required to contribute directly to the universal service fund.¹ On July 30, 2008, Global Conference Partners (GCP) filed a petition seeking partial reconsideration and clarification, and A+ Conferencing, Ltd., Free Conferencing Corporation, and the Conference Group jointly filed a petition for reconsideration of the *InterCall Order*.² In its petition, GCP requests, among other things, reconsideration of the Commission's finding in the *InterCall Order* that the stand-alone conference service of InterCall and other similarly-situated providers is not an information service for the purposes of regulatory classification under the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and applicable precedent.³ GCP also requests that the Commission clarify that InterCall's bundled long-distance component is the transmission component of InterCall's service.⁴ The petitioners in the A+ Conferencing Petition for Reconsideration assert that the *InterCall Order* should be reconsidered because, among other things, the Commission provided insufficient notice to non-party teleconferencing service providers as to the scope of the proceeding.⁵ These petitioners further assert that the *InterCall Order* should be reconsidered because it contained material errors of fact and law.⁶

Interested parties may file comments on or before **September 8, 2008**, and reply comments on or before **September 22, 2008**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁷
