A high level Egyptian ministerial delegation participated in the IMF/WB Spring meeting April 16th to April 19th, 2015. During the visit, the ministers met with the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank Group Officials to explore how to enhance cooperation between Egypt and the two institutions. On Wednesday, US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) repatriated dozens of illegally smuggled ancient artifacts to the Government of Egypt. The return of the artifacts was made possible by “Operation Mummy’s Curse,” an ongoing five-year investigation by ICE’s Homeland Security Investigations targeting an international criminal network that illegally smuggled and imported more than 7,000 cultural items from around the world..
