

Egypt's Strategic Value to Global Security and Keeping the Peace



Since the 1978 Camp David Accords and the 1979 Egypt-Israel Treaty of Peace, the Arab Republic of Egypt has been a constant and vigilant ally to maintaining regional and global security. When there is a crisis Egypt has responded in providing equipment, energy, and civil support to Europe, the U.S., and our mutual allies and partners.

1 Suez Canal

Egypt provides expedited U.S. naval access through the Suez Canal for military and global security operations.

2 Gaza

Egypt brokered a truce between Israel and Palestinian factions in the Gaza Strip stopping targeted attacks and civilian casualties.

3 Sinai

Sinai-Egypt helps lead a multinational force and observers to supervise the implementation of the security provisions of the Egyptian-Israeli Peace Treaty and employ the best practices to prevent any violation of it's terms.

4 Eastern Med + Red Sea + Horn of Africa

Egypt led CTF-153 (Red Sea Maritime Security) of the Combined Maritime Forces (CMF) fighting piracy, arms smuggling, and illicit trade.

5 Libya

Egypt is fostering political dialogues amongst Libyans, aligning with U.N.

resolutions, Berlin Conference, and Skhirat Agreement for a Libyan-led and owned process.

6 Sudan

Egypt is exerting every effort to reach a ceasefire and advance the peace process. Egypt currently hosts +5 million Sudanese citizens and has received an additional 300,000 fleeing the current crisis.

7 Ukraine

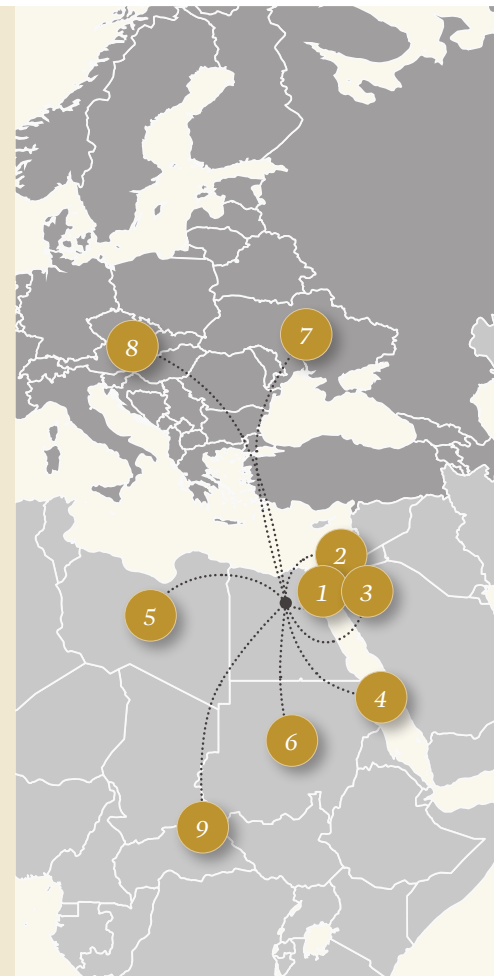
Egypt has voted in favor of U.N. resolutions that condemned the Russian invasion of Ukraine and has suffered severe damages on it's economy (rising food and energy prices, falling tourism revenues, huge and sudden capital outflows, etc.).

8 Europe

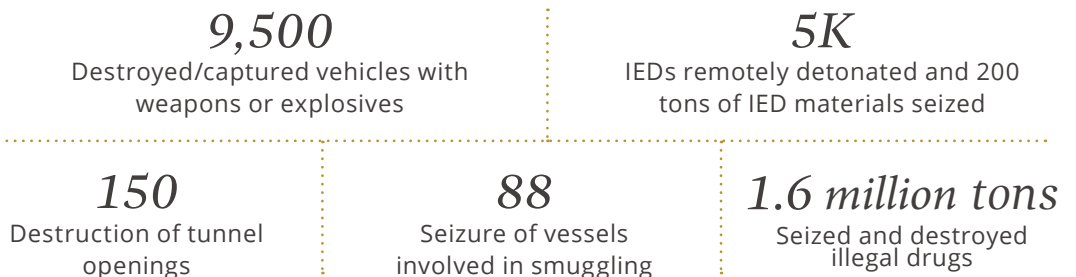
Egypt provides 7.5m tons of LNG to Europe to heat homes, fuel industry, and power the economy.

9 Unregistered Migrants

Egypt maintains effective border control to stem illegal immigration and support over 6 million refugees.



Egypt Border and Maritime Security Operations




Egypt Armed Forces Modernization

The US has approved foreign military sales of various weaponry systems to Egypt since 2020 for an estimated cost of \$8.5 billion.


Fast Facts on Recent Egyptian Armed Forces Modernization
