


#### 8- Information on requesting new national identity cards:

The Egyptian Government decided to delay the Parliamentary elections, which were supposed to be held on March 21, 2015, after The High Constitutional Court ruled the third item of the elections law to be unconstitutional. The Administrative Rules Court also decided to stop the decision of the Elections High Committee to hold the elections on its scheduled time.
