#### 1- Foreign Minister Shoukry Visits DC and Meets with Secretary of State John Kerry:

Minister Shoukry visited D.C., February 8-11, and met with U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry. During the meeting, Secretary Kerry and Minister Shoukry discussed a wide range of regional and international foreign policy issues.

Regarding Egypt-U.S. relations, Minister Shoukry said, "I am here to reiterate and emphasize the importance that Egypt attaches to the strategic relationship that exists with the United States. This is a foundation, a cornerstone of our foreign policy for the last decades, and continues to be one that has been beneficial to Egypt, and I hope beneficial to the United States." On Saturday, President Abdel Fattah El Sisi addressed Egypt's House of Representatives in his first visit to the Parliament that was elected in December of last year. President El Sisi announced that legislative power had been transferred from the executive branch to the Parliament, and called on the legislative institution to set aside political differences in order to meet the people's needs. ### 4- President El Sisi Unveils "Egypt Vision 2030" Sustainable Development Strategy:

On Wednesday, February 24, President Abdel Fattah El Sisi outlined Egypt's progressive sustainable development strategy, "Egypt's Vision 2030." The strategy aims to achieve a comprehensive set of goals to place Egypt among the world's top 30 countries in the areas of economic and social development. In addition to developing critical infrastructure, such as the 5,000 kilometer national road network currently under construction and the 133 bridges scheduled for completion within 20 months, the 2030 vision calls for bolstering small and medium-sized enterprises, developing of



water resources, strengthening rule of law, and improving overall life quality indicators. Read More...
