### **Guideline for Poster Presentation**

**1. Posters should be designed in portrait format**, with the size not exceeding A0 paper size.

(841mm x 1189mm / 33.11" x 46.81"). We recommend that you print on traditional paper with laminate. *No landscape poster will be accepted.*

### 2. Posters should include:

- a) Poster Number: xxx (top left-hand side)
- b) Poster title (top center), followed by Author's Name, Institution, and Contact email address.
- c) Poster body with content (such as Introduction, Materials & Methods, Results (including figures & tables), Discussion & Conclusions, References & Acknowledgements.
- d) Any potential conflict(s) of interest must be disclosed on your poster.

## **3.** Posters must be in English.

- **4.** Ensure good legibility, with the following recommended guidelines:
  - a) Lettering should be legible from 1m (3.28 ft.) away.
  - b) Use larger lettering for the Poster's Title and Author's Name(s).
  - c) The font should be a simple, clean-looking typeface that is easy to read.
  - d) Capital letters and lower-case letters in combination are easier to read than all capital letters.
  - e) Bullets may be helpful in summarizing information.

- We will provide double-sided tape to affix your poster(s) to the Poster Board.
   (Nails, glue, and staple guns may not be used. Pre-stick and similar putty-like adhesives do not work well)
- The Poster Boards will be numbered with your official poster presentation number (as indicated above), Poster Title, and Author(s) Name(s). Please ensure that you use the allocated Poster Board.
- Your poster(s) can be set up at 12:00 p.m. on December 3rd, 2024, for maximum exposure.
- Your poster(s) must remain up for the duration of the conference. You are permitted to take your poster(s) down after 15:30 hrs on December 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
