ESSER funds will be used to safely open and operate schools by funding salaries of staff responsible for continuity of operations, technology, nursing, custodians, and our cleaning contract.

Similar to last summer we will be holding a summer school during June-July 2022 to address learning loss. The summer school program will include SEL, enrichment activities, and a vetted curriculum for providing students with the foundational skills and academic habits they need to be successful in the upcoming grade-level. We will use small group and workshop models to ensure our students are getting targeted support.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act; and (429 of 2000 maximum characters used)

We will use funds to support continuity of operations and to address learning loss during the pandemic. Funds will be used for salaries of operations staff, technology, special education, leadership, nursing, custodians, and to add additional teaching support in the classroom. In addition, funds will be used to support the social and emotional needs of our students with salaries for social workers, and other behavioral staff.

4.
