Public Affairs Requirements

- The Public Affairs major requires a minimum of 120 credits to graduate.
- The completion of 45 credits and a cumulative GPA of 2.25 or greater is necessary to become a Public Affairs student.
- A minimum of 30 credits are from the public affairs core and elective curriculum below (each course is 3 credits unless specified).
- All CUNY Pathways requirements must be satisfied by graduation.
- A minimum of 57 credits must be designated as liberal arts (several Public Affairs courses satisfy the liberal arts credit requirement).
- PAF 1250 or POL 1101 must be completed in the CUNY Pathways Flexible Core or as liberal arts electives.
- Unless specified otherwise, ENG 2150 is a prerequisite for Public Affairs courses listed below.
- Math 1023 or 1030, or placement in Math 2003 or higher is a prerequisite for PAF 3401.

Open only to students who have earned at least a 3.5 GPA in public affairs and a 3.5 cumulative GPA; must submit application prior to the fall semester of their senior year, must be approved by the prospective faculty mentor, Marxe Associate Dean, and the chair of the Committee on Undergraduate Honors. Students accepted for the thesis option do not complete PAF 4401.
