

Can you find a set of tiny 'fire irons'?



The Castle has many open fireplaces where real fires were once lit to warm the rooms. The irons are used to tend the fire without risk of getting burned. See how many large fire irons, like these, you can spot.



This tiny cabinet was made by several different craftspeople.

Can you find a similar pair of large corner cabinets in the King's Dining Room? These cabinets have real pieces of flat gold inserted into the decoration.

This technique is called 'hirage'.



These tiny porcelain vases were made for the Dolls' House by an English company called Worcester.

You can find many different vases in the Castle. Look for these huge Chinese porcelain vases in the Queen's Audience Chamber.



The last item to find is a little copper kettle. Believe it or not, it is made from a 2p coin - you can still see the face of the coin on the bottom! Copper pots are still used in the Great Kitchen.

You may have noted lots of other small treasures in this room. Your task is to find large objects around the Castle which match the tiny ones in this room!



A tiny suit of armour



Where in the Castle can you find armour big enough for adults to wear? You might even find armour which would fit a young boy!



This small bed includes the Royal Cipher. (GMR) What does this stand for?

A similar bed can be found in the King's Bed Chamber. This bed isn't really where The King sleeps! Both beds have what on the top?



This little clock is made by a famous firm called Cartier. Although tiny, it can keep time, but would need to be wound regularly. There are many larger clocks in the Castle and they are kept wound by The King's **horologist**. How many clocks can you find in The Castle?



Find the pocket-sized bust of King Edward VII. You can find a large version in St George's Hall. In this hall are other busts including one over the fireplace, of which Queen?



This impressive throne is an exact copy of a throne from a Palace in Delhi.

Can you find this life-size throne which was made in India for a Queen? I wonder why a stool had to be made for this throne?



This miniature painting is of Mary Queen of Scots. You may be able to find this very similar painting of a princess before she became Queen Elizabeth I. The two ladies were related in real life. Can you find out how they were related?



The top of the table is created using a technique of inlaid, coloured, hard stones known as **pietra dure**.



There are some beautiful tables in The Castle including some made of silver in the Queen's Gallery. One of these has a large piece of fruit at its feet. What type of fruit is it?
