Walking track classification

Class 3 track Australian Standards

- Gently sloping, well-defined track usually with slight inclines or few to many steps.
- Steep sections occur.
- Caution needed on creek crossings, ladders, steps and lookouts.
- Reasonable level of fitness required.

Class 4 track Australian Standards

- Distinct track usually with steep exposed slopes or many steps.
- Caution needed on loose surfaces and exposed natural outlooks.
- Moderate level of fitness and ankle-supporting footwear needed.

Class 5 track Australian Standards

- Steep track with irregular surface and loose stones.
- Requires high level of physical fitness. Considerable exposure to the elements may be experienced.
- Shoes with flexible soles and good grip should be worn.

Trail markers along the Great Walk indicate where the track leads.
