30km/h speed limit applies:

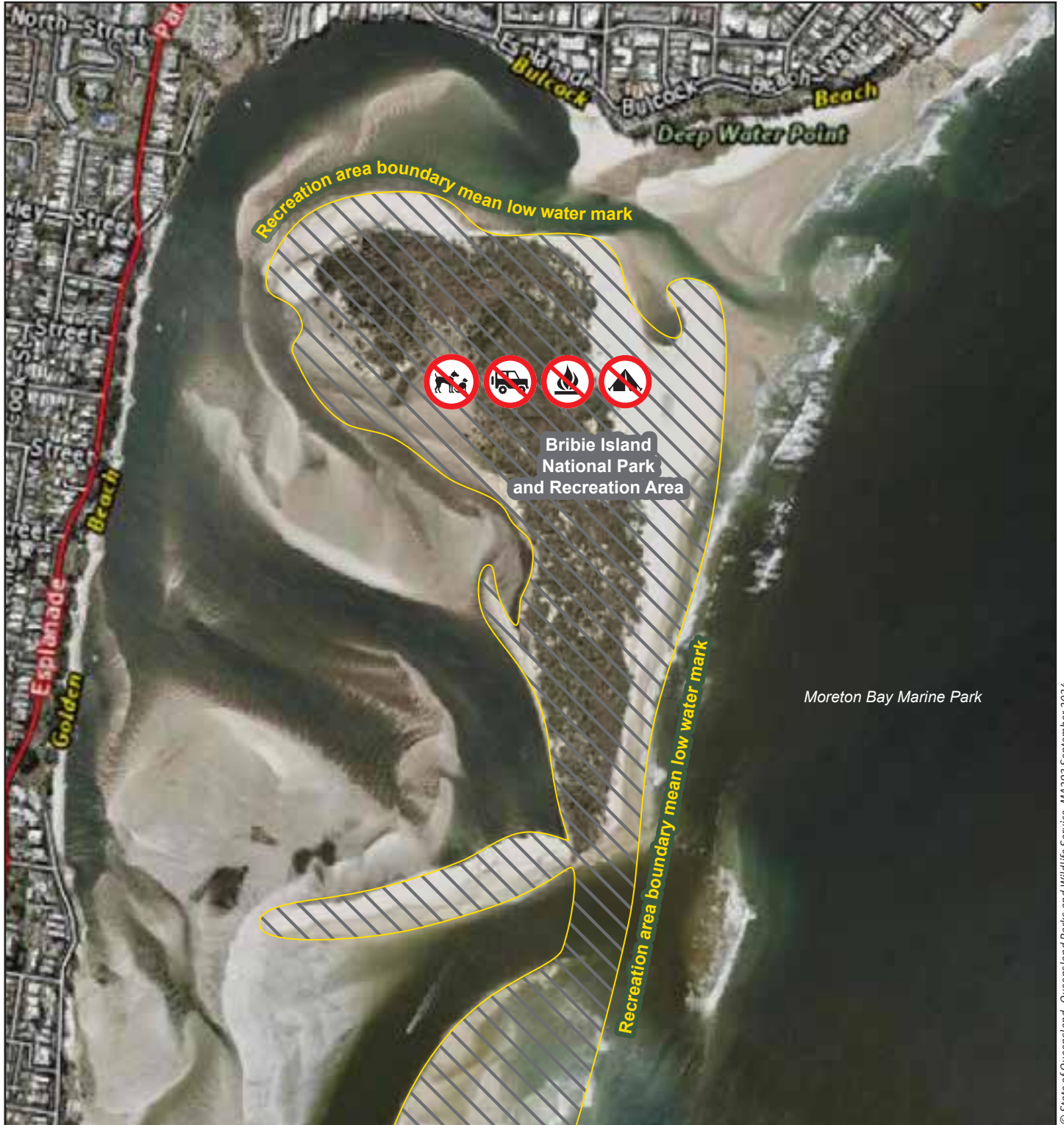
- Ocean Beach camping area north to the vehicle closure.
