Claims Nos.: 1 (partially), 2-6, 7 (partially), 8-18 (partially), 19-33

Present claims 1(partially), 2-6, 7 (partially), 8-18 (partially), 19-33 relate to an extremely large number of possible products/methods. Support within the meaning of Article 6 PCT and disclosure within the meaning of Article 5 PCT is to be found, however, for only a very small proportion of the products/methods claimed. In the present case, the claims so lack support, and the application so lacks disclosure, that a meaningful search over the whole of the claimed scope is impossible. Said claims refer to isolated polypeptidescomprising a VH domain selected from the group consisting of VH domains belonging to VH1a-, VH1b-, VH2-, VH4-, VH5- and VH6- subclass. Experimental data are given only for the VH6 subclass domain. Since two of the substitutions do not reach the alleged effect (D72 and G76) (see p. 47 l. 8-11, p. 68 l. 9-11, and p. 68 l. 17-20) the results obtained from the VH6 sublass domain cannot be transferred to the other subclasses or even other substitutions based on the differences between the sequence of the VH3 subclass domain and VH6, i.e. V44, F78, R97+E99, E99. Furthermore, since "it could not be a priori excluded that changes in the framework might affect the orientation of the CDRs", and an unchanged antigen recognition is only shown for the examined mutations (see p. 75 l. 11-15), said results cannot be applied to any substitution in any antibody sequence. Consequently, the search has been carried out for those parts of the claims which appear to be supported and disclosed, namely those parts relating to the products/methods

- 1. a polypeptide comprising a VH domain belonging to the VH6 subclass (defined either by the residues disclosed in the Tables 2 and 3 of the present application or by the word "VH6") wherein said VH domain comprises at least one amino acid residue selected from the group consisting of

- b. the amino acid at position 16 to G
