Key achievements to date:

- Further development of the playground buddy scheme including improvement of skillset for children.
- Further improve the outdoor learning offer by acquiring more resources to support this area.
- Further develop the link between local sports teams and Newhall Park Primary school.
- Further development with after school sports clubs and the variety of sports offered to the children.
- Continued use of the PE planning tool leading to the improvement of teacher knowledge.
- Further development of the Newhall Marathon to engage children within physical activity.
